### Anti-Doping Division

The Court for Arbitration for Sport's Anti-Doping Division is responsible for adjudicating alleged anti-doping rule violations in archery to ensure independence in the case management process. This includes issuing any relevant sanctions. The former three-member World Archery Anti-Doping Panel ceased to exist after the agreement was signed with the Court for Arbitration for Sport in 2019.

## Members

### Online chats

Feedback on the first five online calls for member associations has been positive, so they will continue to be held every month.

### Application

The Yemen Archery Federation has submitted a membership application as per World Archery rule 1.5.1. According to rule 1.5.2, current World Archery member associations and members of the executive board have 60 days to raise any objections to this affiliation request in writing to the World Archery office.

Without any serious objection before 24 September 2019, temporary membership will be granted to the Yemen Archery Federation until the next congress in 2021 where the final membership of this national archery association will be submitted to a vote.

### Temporary membership

The Archery Association of St. Vincent & the Grenadines was accepted as temporary member on 29 June 2019. The Niue Archery Association will become temporary member as of 28 July 2019. A decision on their full membership will be taken at World Archery Congress in 2021.

## Clean Sport

### Communication of sanctions

Para compound archer Jaroslav Zelenka of the Czech Republic has been suspended under clean sport rules. The athlete was found in violation of Article 34.2.1 of the World Archery Anti-Doping Rules after testing positive for the prohibited substance Furosemide, which belongs to the diuretics and masking agents class of the World Anti-Doping Agency prohibited list. Sanctions imposed are as follows:

- Disqualification of all prizes, points, medals and results obtained since 5 July 2018.
- A 13-month period of suspension until 8 December 2019.

## Achievements

### World rankings

Alexis Ruiz has made it into the number one spot in the compound women's world rankings after winning the fourth stage of the 2019 Hyundai Archery World Cup in Berlin, Germany and the release of a new list on Monday 8 July. The 19-year-old was the only archer to climb the podium at every stage of the international circuit in 2019, her debut season.



### Longines Prize

Sara Lopez of Colombia received the Longines Prize for Precision for compound women after shooting 70% of her arrows into the 10-ring at the fourth stage of the 2019 Hyundai Archery World Cup in Berlin, Germany. The world number two was the top seed and finished third in a shoot-off. Her opponent in the bronze medal match, Yesim Bostan, came second with 62%. Stage winner Alexis Ruiz was third with 57%.

### Universiade records

Yesim Bostan and Danelle Wentzel tied for the high score over compound women's qualification at the 2019 Summer Universiade in Napoli, Italy with 701 points – a new Universiade record – but the Turkish world number four took the top seed because she shot 27 Xs to Danelle's 24. Kim Jongho beat his own Universiade record of 705 points with 716 for the 72-arrow 50-metre ranking round.

### Berlin 2019

### Moscow 2019

Twenty-six of the 28 qualifier spaces at the Moscow 2019 Hyundai Archery World Cup Final were decided by the end of the semifinals at the fourth stage of the international circuit in Berlin, Germany. There was a single spot in each of the recurve men's and recurve women's competitions left to confirm.




World Archery Champion Natalia Avdeeva, Anton Bulaev, Sayana Tsyrempilova and Artem Makhnenko have been named as host nation invitees to the 2019 Hyundai Archery World Cup Final in Moscow, Russia. Five Russian athletes will compete in total after Ksenia Perova qualified on points.

Korean archers Lee Woo Seok and An San have withdrawn from the 2019 Hyundai Archery World Cup Final and will be replaced in the line-up by Bae Jaehyeon and Melanie Gaubil. The world number four and the Olympic test event winner have said they are prioritising the national selection events, with their sights set on Tokyo 2020.

### Napoli 2019

The finals at the 2019 Summer Universiade in Napoli, Italy were held next to Caserta Palace, an 18th-century former royal residence situated 30 kilometres north of Napoli. Russia's Anton Bulaev and Mexico's Andrea Becerra won the compound men's and women's gold medals. Korea, Turkey and Estonia took the compound team titles.

Kang Chae Young and Lee Woo Seok won the recurve women's and men's titles as Korea led the medal table with four golds and eight podiums in total. Kang faced another Korean archer, Choi Misun, in the recurve women's gold medal match and a double-shoot-off was needed to decide the winner. The two Korean archers shot together and won the recurve women's team event in Napoli.



Russia beat Chinese Taipei to recurve men's team gold, 5-1, but Taipei took the recurve mixed team title over Japan, 5-3. The team events at the 2019 Universiade consisted of two athletes rather than the standard three. Results of the team event will not contribute to the world rankings. In 2021, the next edition of the Summer Universiade takes place in Chengdu, China in August.

### Pacific Games

Fiji's Fred and Lisa Leota collected three medals, including two golds, at the 2019 Pacific Games in Apia, Samoa. The married couple won the compound mixed team title, beating New Caledonia in the final, 143-141. Fred took compound men's gold after a shoot-off and Lisa finished second to Cecile Picot in the compound women's competition. Archers from Tahiti, New Caledonia and host Samoa also topped the podium.

### Tokyo Test Event

Yumenoshima Archery Field hosted its first international competition on 11-18 July 2019. Some 131 athletes from 29 countries participated in the Ready Steady Tokyo test event, which was held in the same venue that will be used next summer for the Olympic and Paralympic Games.

Top seeds Kim Woojin and Jeon Ina beat Russia's Artem Makhnenko and Ksenia Perova in straight sets in the recurve mixed team final. The mixed team event will make its debut on the Olympic programme at Tokyo 2020, bringing the total number of gold medals available in the archery events to five.

Korea's An San beat Deepika Kumari of India in straight sets, 6-0, to take the recurve women's gold medal. The 18-year-old previously beat teammate and reigning Olympic Champion Chang Hye Jin and Chinese Taipei's Tan Ya-Ting before stepping out to face Kumari in the final.

Lee Seungyun beat teammate Kim Woojin in straight sets in the recurve men's final to take Korea's third gold medal of the Ready Steady Tokyo test event. After An San's women's victory and gold in the pairs, Seungyun's men's gold makes it a Korean clean sweep of the podiums at this test event. Korean archers won all four gold medals at the last Olympics in Rio.

**Tokyo 2020**

Olivia Hodgson and Adam Kaluzny beat Australia’s Alice Ingle and Astin Darcy in the final of a recurve mixed team qualification tournament held during the Samoa 2019 Pacific Games to win New Zealand two quota places for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games. New Zealand has not had an archer at the Olympics since 2004 when Ken Uprichard made his second consecutive appearance at the Games.





Tokyo 2020 has released the designs of next summer’s Olympic medals as part of the one-year-to-go celebrations in Japan. The medals will be manufactured with metals recycled from consumer electronics. More than 400 professional designers and students submitted proposals in an open competition. Junichi Kawanishi is responsible for the winning design.

**Lima 2019**

The archery competition of the Lima 2019 Pan American Games will take place at the rugby facilities of the Villa Maria del Triunfo Sports Complex and will start on 7 August with the qualification round in the four categories. Compound finals will be shot on 10 August and recurve medal matches on 11 August. Two men’s and two women’s Olympic quota places will be allocated in Lima.



**Caribbean Championships**

The Third Caribbean Development Championships were held in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic on 28-30 June 2019 with a record-breaking participation of 88 archers from eight countries. Archers competed in two divisions based on the equipment used and their level of experience. The fourth Caribbean Development Championships will be held in 2020, and place and dates will be allocated at the World Archery Americas general assembly in Lima, Peru on 5 August 2019.

**E-Learning and Coaching Certification**

World Archery is about to launch an online certification programme for archery coaches. The level one programme will start on 1 August, includes eight modules online prior to a five-day final practical component. Candidates have to complete evaluations of both parts. The online course content will soon be available in French in advance of a pilot course on 21-26 January 2020.
