16. If you are successful in this position, please describe the ideas, projects and activities you plan to implement for World Archery

I have been working in the Judge Committee since 2015 and in these few years we have been able to take up and successfully complete quite a number of activities. One of the key tasks that we carried out was the entire revamp of Book 1 Appendix 4, that outlines the role, duty, hierarchy and other aspects of a World Archery Judge and the tasks of the Judge Committee, which lacked the relevance to the current structure of WA and also lacked the updates in recent years which had raised a dire need to modify the same.

Beside this, I have been also involved with the development team on building the National Judge Training course for African continent. Understanding the local needs, we have decided on breaking the training program in 2 parts – one basic and one intermediate level. We have been working on the basic part and are near to the completion stage for the same. The idea is to make this fundamental enough and global enough so that this can be leveraged by the other continents as well for the basic introduction to archery judging. As a follow on here, if I am re-elected, I will continue to support the team on developing the part 2 of the training program as well as see on how we can integrate this with the development work that is being done across other continents.

Also I like to believe that we are on a continuous improvement path. In the past we have been continuously reviewing the rules and procedures and have suggested quite a number of bylaws & interpretations in order to bring in completeness & consistency in understanding of the rules. We have been one of the committees who has been submitting most number of changes and asking for maximum number of clarifications. A lot of them have been approved while some of them have been asked referred back by the EB to us asking for discussion with the other committees involved – and that's is reflected in the inter-committee meetings where we had the second most number of interactions. One of my key tasks being handling the interpretations and bylaws from the Judge Committee's perspective and that is something I would definitely keep on with if I am re-elected, since this is a crucial part of continuous improvement.

In addition to the above, during this tenure, we had also created the competency framework for our Judges – which outlines the skills, knowledge and values required to be a WA Judge and also helps an individual to identify the development areas where one should focus in order to become a top ranked WA Judge. Not only did we work on creating the framework, but we also engaged a 4 task force comprising of some of the most experienced and knowledgeable people from of judge fraternity which shows our endeavor on creating a more collaborative and knowledge sharing and learning environment for the entire Judging family. Continuing on the same, what we feel in the committee and which follows as a natural extension to this is embedding these frameworks in our re-accreditation conference and seminars.

Outside the ones which I have already mentioned, there are other regular tasks that we perform which I believe are part of the continuous improvement process and hence they will be a part of the activities in future as well just to ensure we keep the current ongoing momentum of taking our judging standards to the next higher level. Some of them to mention are conducting the judge conferences and the seminars, working closely with the Continental Judge Committees and providing support wherever needed, updating the Judge's Guidebook, completion of the re-accreditation procedure for our existing Judges', timely publication of the newsletter and providing all necessary information related to rules, bylaws and interpretations at the right time, working closely with the Field & 3D committee to improve the knowledge and understanding of the Field & 3D archery amongst a greater pool of judges.

Continue (if necessary)	<p>Alongside the above, there are a few more projects which have been in our pipeline and, if re-elected, we intend to keep working on. Over the past few years we have been able to streamline the feedback mechanism about the events and the judges from the chair, but now we want to move to digital format for the same so the process can be more simplified and automated. We have made the reaccreditation structure more robust with multiple layers of test in each period, but now we want to move towards an online re-accreditation process. While archery has grown at an amazing pace, it has also seen the advent of new technologies which sometime has been hard to keep up with from an information flow perspective. What we plan on is having a digital library of the different equipment's and items which appear in a tournament for the first time, can be posted in this platform and we can use this as a library for a smoother information flow.</p> <p>As you all may know it, I have been involved with archery for quite a long time and am quite passionate on improving the sport further, hence it will be an honor to continue to work with the committee in future as well.</p>
