As soon as the Electoral Board has validated the eligibility the status will be updated, and the form will be published as part of the Congress documents. This form will be published without the personal data. Only in case insufficient valid candidatures are received a 2nd round will be opened after the 19 June 2021.

It is reminded: a person cannot be candidate for more than 2 positions. (If a candidate is candidate for 2 positions, then 2 forms must be completed)


I also confirm by signing that I do not fulfil any of the below conditions that render a candidature for not being eligible:
