Introduction

As we approach the end of 2023, I would like to provide you with a summary of our activities and progress over the past years.

Our committee has been very active past years, with regular meetings held at most of the World Cup events. At these meetings, we discussed a range of topics related to coaching in archery, including coaching techniques, athlete development, and support for coaches.

At all major competitions, at least one or more members of the Coach Committee has participated, and as such we have been the intermediary between coaches and World Archery or Local Organizing Committee's many times. To clarify and/or voice the opinions of other coaches.

From 4th to 6th of November 2022, respected colleague coaches and members of the coach committee presented interesting views and insight into their training programs, coaching views and experiences at the World Archery Excellence Center.

Another important focus for our committee member last years has been to model good coaching practices for all coaches. We believe that by setting a good example, we can help coaches to improve their skills and better support their athletes.



Goal

As coach committee we encourage World Archery to use the World Cup as the breeding ground for implementing new ideas and rule changes that benefit our sport. We have been involved and consulted by World Archery in many changes; like the change from 40 seconds to 30 seconds per arrow and for the change to 1/64th elimination rounds with points for top-8 qualification finishers (instead of the top-8 bye system of 1/48 and 1/24). We appreciate the fact that World Archery involves us in those changes.

Finally, we have been working on an ongoing issue related to coaches' positions at international tournaments, particularly during team elimination rounds. We believe that coaches should be included as team members in the rules, so that they can do their job during team rounds. Specifically, we recommend that team coaches' positions be closer to the team box than the media line behind.
