3.3 Practice

- The training range is next to the main qualification range located at POCOL, next to the Hotel Argentina.
- Practice at the finals venue will be available for those athletes competing in the finals 8 and 9 September. The range opens from 08:00hrs for the morning session and from 17:00hrs for the evening session.
- POCOL training range is available from 3 September

Monday 3 10:00-18:00hrs

Tuesday 4 (see official practice below)

Wednesday 5 – Thursday 6 08:30-16:00hrs Friday 7 08:00-16:00hrs

Official Practice

Official practice will be split in two groups, the groups will be divided by country. The assignment will be in the official schedule.

- 10:00hrs 13:00hrs
- 13:00hrs 16:00hrs

Qualification Round Practice

- Ends of 4 minutes practice on the practice field.
- Non-competing athletes can use the practice field, walking distance of the qualification competition venue.
- Transportation is available for athletes between the qualification field, training range and official event hotels. Schedule will be displayed in the official event hotel lobbies.

3.4. Equipment Inspection:

- Tuesday 4 September, during official practice.
- Located to the left of the field.
- Teams will be announced in (English) alphabetical order by the DOS.
- All teams are to wear their team uniform and have their valid accreditation.
- Spare equipment must also be brought for inspection.
- Team Managers are to check the details of their athletes such as, name, date
 of birth are correct beforehand.
- Inform the judge if details are not correct and the judge will inform the World















Archery Results Team.

Instructions to use the tablet scoring system will be carried out if requested.

Athlete Numbers:

- Athlete numbers will be issued on the day of the qualification round (with the score cards) during practice.
- Athlete numbers must be worn on the quiver or thigh, facing the waiting line while shooting.

The Environment:

• Team Managers, please instruct your team members to use the litter bins located on the competition, practice ranges and common areas at all times.

Water:

- In an effort to aid the environment, water will be distributed using the familiar World Archery bottle deposit system.
- 2 tokens will be given to all accredited persons at registration. Two bottles of water will be given with the token.
- A new bottle of water will only be issued by the return of the empty bottle or with a token. If the empty bottle has been lost, please contact the Organising Committee in the LOC Office.
- Please make sure to give empty bottles back to the water station. Do not throw them in the trash bin. Please use the trash bins provided and clear the area you have used on the FOP before leaving.

Non-Smoking

- This is a non-smoking event.
- Smoking is forbidden inside public buildings and all competition and training areas. This also includes electronic cigarettes, refer to book 4, Art. 26.4.
- Smoking areas are indicated for those that do smoke.

3.5. Qualification Round

- September 5th Unmarked
- September 6th Marked
- Group assignments will be published by the World Archery Results Team on the World Archery website.
- Athletes ranked 1st and 2nd (in each category) after the qualification rounds will be qualified for the semi-finals. Athletes ranked 3rd through 22nd will be qualified for the elimination rounds.
- Announcements, music and commentary will be heard at the practice range from 4 September – 9 September

SCORING PROCEDURE Scorecards management / athlete involvement

- Each group will be given 1 scorecard per athlete and 1 tablet.
- Scoring will be done by the athletes. One athlete records the scores on the













official paper-based score sheets and another inputs into the tablet. The other athletes should verify that all scores are written and entered correctly.

- Athletes must complete all sections of the score sheets, check and sign the score sheets before returning them together with the tablet to the results teams after each round.
- Shoot-off for entry into the Elimination Round will be decided by a one arrow shoot off "closest to the centre" (40 sec of time) and will take place at a dedicated target on the practice field.
- Team shoot offs for entry into the eliminations will take place at a target on the Practice Field after the second qualification day results are calculated.
- Athletes must ensure they are available when called for a shoot-off.

3.6. Individual Elimination Round

The elimination rounds follow the World Archery rules as per April 1st 2018. Athletes ranked 3rd to 22nd in each category will be assigned into pools (A, B, C or D). Athletes will then shoot matches using the "winner stays on" principle.

- There will be 3 elimination round courses of 6 targets each.
- Different matches start at different targets, 4 matches of the same category at the same time.
- All targets will be marked distances.
- Each course will include at least one of each target face size.
- Each target will have multiple (possible) shooting pegs. All appropriate for the target (face) in use.
- There will be a judge accompanying each match.
- The judge will indicate which shooting peg (and distance) to use for the match at each target.
- Shooting time is 2 minutes, timed by the judge.
- In case of a tie in the match; a shoot-off will take place on the last target shot.
- The winner of each match stays to continue on the next round against the next highest ranked athlete in the pool.

- Athletes must complete all sections of the score sheets, check and sign the score sheets before returning them to the results teams after each round.

3.7. Team Elimination Round

The team elimination rounds follow the World Archery rules as per April 1st 2018

- There are 3 courses for the team elimination rounds
- All courses will have 4 targets, one of each target face size
- All targets will be marked distances
- There will be a judge accompanying each match
- Shooting time is 2 minutes, timed by the judge
- In case of a tie in the match; A shoot-off will take place on the last target shot
- During finals, announcements, commentary and music will be played for spectators

3.7.4. Senior Team semi finals

- Saturday 8 September
- Recurve, Compound and Barebow
- 4 targets of 3 arrows, 1 arrow per athlete (cumulative scoring)

3.8. Team Medal Matches

- Saturday 8 September
- Recurve, Compound and Barebow
- Finals to be staged at the Olympic Ski Jump.
- 4 targets of 3 arrows, 1 arrow per athlete (cumulative score)
- Venue for finals will have one "Warm Up" field.









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Warm-Up field:

- o Located a short walk from the Finals FoP
- o Will have 4 targets.
- Warm up targets close to the FoP will be available for athletes 60 minutes prior to their match.
- o The area will have water, tents, chairs and tables.
- o Will be open 1 hour before the start of competition.
- Athletes are not permitted to use scopes on the finals FOP. Coaches will be allowed to use a scope or binoculars in the coaches' box on the main FOP.
- Athletes should be in this area 45 mins before their match. It is the athletes' responsibility to be at the Finals Warm-up area 45 mins before the scheduled match. They will be called for their match from this location.
- Coaches will be fitted with a wired individual microphone to record their comments for TV purposes. No sound will go out to the venue. Microphones will only be activated immediately when entering the FoP for the match and removed when the match is completed, while exiting the finals FoP. Coaches' comments will be recorded for use in the TV highlights and on matches placed on www.archery.tv platform.
- During finals, announcements, commentary and music will be played for spectators.

3.9. Individual Finals

- Sunday 9th September
- Recurve, Compound and Barebow
- Finals to be staged at the Olympic Ski Jump.
- 4 targets of 3 arrows, 3 arrow per athlete (cumulative score)
- Venue for finals will have one "Warm Up" field.
- Warm-Up field:
 - o Located a short walk from the Finals FoP
 - o Will have 4 targets.
 - Warm up targets close to the FoP will be available for athletes 60 minutes prior to their match.
 - o The area will have water, tents, chairs and tables.
 - o Will be open 1 hour before the start of competition.
- Athletes are not permitted to use scopes on the finals FOP. Coaches will be allowed to use a scope or binoculars in the coaches' box on the main FOP.
- Athletes should be in this area 45 mins before their match. It is the athletes' responsibility to be at the Finals Warm-up area 45 mins before the scheduled match. They will be called for their match from this location.
- Coaches will be fitted with a wired individual microphone to record their comments for TV purposes. No sound will go out to the venue. Microphones will only be activated immediately when entering the FoP for the match and removed when the match is completed, while exiting the finals FoP. Coaches' comments will be recorded for use in the TV highlights and on matches













placed on www.archery.tv platform.

 During finals, announcements, commentary and music will be played for spectators

3.10. Appeal Procedure (Form attached)

- An Appeal form is attached to this document (see attached after this chapter, Appendix 1).
- In case of an intent to appeal or an actual appeal, the times indicated on the Appeal form must be considered.
- Appeal forms should be given to the Chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission or to their deputy.
- A fee of US\$50 (Euro 50.-) must be paid to the Chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission, for the appeal to be valid.
- If the appeal is upheld by the Jury of Appeal, the fee will be returned. In the case of the appeal being rejected, the fee will not be returned.

4. Technical Matters (TD + Chairperson of Judges)

4.1 Timing Control System

• During medal finals LONGINES Timing equipment will be used for timing.

4.2. Results System

- The World Archery results verifier is responsible for the results.
- IMPORTANT NOTE: There will be internet access in the official hotels. Because of this we will not distribute any printed results and information. There will be no pigeon boxes on the field.

4.3 Rules that apply in this event

Fair Play:

- All participants are to enjoy the championships and avoid behaviour that would spoil this for others.
- World Archery would like to remind participants that there are to be no
 personal devices such as, mobile/cell phones/cameras, communication
 devices (including smart watches) on the course. If a participant is found
 with a forbidden device, this they will be at risk of disqualification.
 Participants are encouraged to promote fair play and report any incidences of
 unfair play immediately to a judge.
- Judges have the right to check equipment, including bags while on the course, but need the cooperation of participants to report any issues they become aware of.
- Mark all arrow holes on every target that your athletes shoot on.
- Time warnings will be given to athletes that are taking longer at targets than
 they should be. Participants are encouraged to report any time issues to
 judges as quickly as possible.
- Un-sportsmanlike behaviour will not be tolerated from any athletes, coaches, team managers or spectators. If it is suspected that distances, slopes, cuts













are being communicated accreditation will be confiscated and spectators removed from viewing areas.

Books 2 and 4 contain the rules for this event:

The interpretation relating to marks on the rear of the riser and limbs will be enforced at equipment inspection. Please make sure your athletes are aware. For recurve and compound, marks applied by the manufacturer are permitted. Any additional marks or stickers must be removed on the side facing the athletes.

For barebow, in addition, the sight window must be plain. Any marks or patterns must be covered.

4.3.1. Dress Regulations

- Athletes, officials and staff members should wear the appropriate clothing and have the correct appearance when on the field during competition.
- The rules permit the wearing of the athlete's choice of trouser (including denim) for the Qualification and Elimination round. No denim will be permitted on the Finals Days.
- Camo will not be permitted at any stage of the event on any item.
- Athletes, team officials and technicians should wear their national team uniform top/shirt/jacket and suitable shoes having the same appearance as per the division, following World Archery rules.
- For finals day, full team uniform is to be worn.
- We would like to remind all teams that athlete names and country names or code are mandatory on the back of their national team uniform shirts for athletes participating in World Archery major events.

4.4 Accreditation Cards Rules for 2018 and the future

Rule Book 2 - 3.8 Accreditation

- 3.8.1.1. Proof of accreditation shall be carried at all times on the competition area and shall be shown on request of appropriate officials.
- 3.8.1.2. Only holders of appropriate accreditation shall be allowed onto the relevant parts of the competition area.






















Accreditation Card:

- Athletes and team officials, registered in WAREOS, will be issued a World Archery accreditation and lanyard. Please ensure all details are correctly entered in WAREOS.
- Only one accreditation will be issued, with a lanyard, for all the 2018 season.
 Athletes and team officials should bring their accreditation to all World Archery events such as, World Championships, Hyundai Archery World Cup stages and the Hyundai Archery World Cup Final.
- Accreditation will consist of, a photograph, full name, role, category/bow discipline, country of representation, individual World Archery ID code and access privileges.
- All accreditations will need to be validated and activated on site at each of the separate World Archery events.
- There is a QR code on all accreditations that will be scanned to enter and exit the competition areas.

Photographs:

- Will be taken on venue two days before official practice.
- For a valid photograph, persons are to smile and wear their official Member Association team uniform. No hats or sunglasses can be worn.
- Photos are used for both event accreditation and website biographies.
- Athletes and team official profile photographs expire after 24 months.
- Any athlete or official that desires to update their photograph in the system can go to the accreditation area to do so.

Lost/Damage/Replacement Costs:

 For those persons that unfortunately forget to bring, damage or lose their accreditation, can purchase another accreditation from World Archery accreditation area at the event for the cost of 30 EUR (30 USD).

Upgrade Card:

- Upgrade cards are available for those teams that do not have a coach or team manager available on their team and wish to have a coach for their athlete/team's match.
- An upgrade card can be allocated to another athlete or accredited person to perform the role of coach for a specific athlete at that particular event.









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- Upgrade cards (serial numbered) are individually allocated/valid to an individual person for a particular event athlete/team. As soon as the athlete/team is out of the competition, the upgrade card is no longer active.
- For an upgrade card to be issued, an Accreditation Upgrade Form (AUF)
 needs to be completed and signed by the Team Manager, President or
 Secretary General of the Member Association of the athlete/team to be
 coached. This form can be completed in advance in WAREOS or on venue.
- Each upgrade cards costs 30 EUR (30 USD)
- Remember, as stated in the World Archery rules, only 1 accredited team
 official per athlete is allowed with a maximum of 4 officials if a team has more
 than 4 athletes competing on the field of play.

5. Logistical Aspects (OC)

5.1. Transportation

 Updated daily transport schedules will be displayed at the competition field and the lobby of all official hotels. Participants are aware that at the Pocol WACF area cars, minivan, minibus, camper's parking is strictly forbidden. A FD Shuttle service is scheduled from 5 different pick up point throughout the city to Pocol and vice versa.

5.1.1. Transport from the Airport to Cortina

- At Venice airport, look for the LOC representative at LOC information point just outside arrival area.
- Arriving team members will receive one tag for every bag (max3). For those
 that may need to wait for their transfer (maximum 2 hours), a free deposit
 baggage storage area will be available. An LOC representative will also
 distribute luggage tags to every participant and a free 3 euro voucher to be
 spent at the two bars/restaurant located in the arrival area while waiting for
 the transfer. If a team member spends more than 3 euros, they will need to
 cover the extra cost themselves.
- 15 minutes before transfer leaves, another LOC representative will gather all the team members and their personal belongings, to be taken to the bus stop area (5 minute on walk). An LOC representative will assist to load and board the bus as needed.

5.2. Meals during the event

- Breakfast will be served at the hotels
- Dinner to be served either:
 - o At the hotel restaurant, for those hotels with their own restaurant.
 - Vouchers, for those hotels without their own restaurant, to use a recommended list of local restaurants scattered throughout the city of Cortina.
- Catering Times in general:
 - o Breakfast 07:30 09:00hrs













o If really necessary, the LOC can arrange breakfast to start at 06:30hrs for those participants that need to start early.

o Dinner 19:00 - 21:00hrs

*Check with your hotel to make sure dinner times have not changed

5.3. Top Things to do in Cortina

The following is only a short list of the sights and attractions that Cortina has to offer:

Mountain Hikes

With a total of 300 km of trails, this area offers an immense array of mountain walks and hikes at various levels of difficulty and durations. The most evocative of these include: The Montanelli trail from Pie Tofana, the tour of the Val Travenanzes and the Fanes waterfalls (for expert hillwalkers), excursions to Federa Lake, and trips to Lake Pianozes, Lake d'Ajal, Lake Ghedina and, last but not least, Lake Sorapis, which is famed for the turquoise colour of its waters. The Dolomiti d'Ampezzo National Park plays host to all manner of enchanting walks.

High-Altitude thrills and chills

This part of Italy plays host to numerous mountain bike trails, fixed-aid climbing routes and rock faces that are perfect for tackling in the summer. Exploring the mountains and promoting mountaineering are the main objectives of the "Scoiattoli di Cortina" (Cortina Squirrels), a long-established group of amateur climbers who are renowned for having blazed the trail on numerous climbing routes and for the myriad expeditions. The mountain and natural-history guides who work around Cortina organize "Safe Adventures", which include excursions, hikes, ascents, rock-climbing courses and free-climbing trips.

Summer alternatives to climbing include canyoning and exploring the adventure park.

History, art and culture in spades

Cortina is more than just a tourist hotspot – it is also a favourite destination of culture vultures, playing host as it does to high-quality art exhibitions and literary events, as well as meetings with leading names in the worlds of film, politics and journalism, not to mention highly enjoyable and enlightening musical and cultural events.

The entertainment offers a ranges from folklore to music, and even takes in major sporting events including the Women's Downhill Skiing World Championships; the "Dobbiaco-Cortina" international cross-country skiing competition; the Italian "A" League-ice-hockey championship; and of course the Archery World Championships.

6. Protocol and ceremonies (OC)

6.1. Medal Ceremonies

All athletes involved in the ceremonies are requested to go to the gathering













point by the athletes' entrance to the main FoP, equipment can be stored in the staging area until the end of their particular victory ceremony.

- Bronze medal winners are requested to be present at the finals venue gathering point of the Award Ceremony, 10 minutes before the ceremonies are due to start.
- Medal ceremonies will be conducted immediately after the conclusion of each gold medal match of each category during the days of the finals (please check the competition schedule).

Mixed Zone and Press Conferences:

 Interviews will take place at the Mixed Zone and athletes will be requested to pass through the mixed zone to speak with the media.

7. Medical Related issues (Medical representative)

- First Aid services will be available from 4 7 September at the qualification venue and 8 - 9 September at the finals venue.
- The closest hospital for emergencies is the Istituto Codivilla, Via Codivilla, 1, 32042, Cortina d'Ampezzo +39 0436883111

8. Clean Sport

8.1 Anti-Doping control

- Anti-Doping control will follow World Archery rules (Hyundai Archery World Cup and World Ranking events).
- Athletes should bring their passports and/or accreditation cards to the anti-doping control station if selected for a test.

8.2. Alcohol test

 Athletes and officials should also be available for random alcohol testing during the competition, following World Archery rules.

9. Other matters of importance (ED)
