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PRELIMINARY & FINAL REGISTRATION

All entries, accommodation reservations, transport needs, flight arrival/departure information and visa invitation letter requests are to be completed using WAREOS.

The World Archery Online Registration System (WAREOS): <http://register.worldarchery.org> now handles the entire registration process for this event. No entry forms, hotel reservations or transport forms will be accepted; all information is to be entered into WAREOS.

Member Associations can log in to WAREOS at <http://register.worldarchery.org> with your Username and Password assigned by World Archery. After entering WAREOS, please find the event from the list, you wish to register your athletes. Select/press the "Entries" button to see the list of categories in the event. Select/press the "category" to enter the athlete and official numbers/details participating for that event. A *WAREOS User Manual* can be downloaded in PDF format (English) upon login.

A maximum number of **four (4) athletes per country** (host country included) is allowed to be registered into each category of the event. Preliminary entries have to be completed using WAREOS.

Please respect the stated deadlines.

Member Associations can only use WAREOS to make any changes/amendments to their entries and will be able to do so at any time. An email will be automatically sent to the Organizing Committee and Member Association with the updated information in WAREOS.

Any changes that are made after the deadlines specified or if entries differ by more than 4 athletes from the preliminary entries, the following penalty fees will automatically be applied.

Lost accreditation.	30 each
Changes made to the athlete and/or team official names after the final entry deadline date and within 3 days prior to the start of the event.	50 each change

NOTE: CHF currency exchange rates will be those on the date of the event.

Member Associations that have penalty fees outstanding from 2019 will need to have paid these penalty fees before being eligible to enter and compete.

Any entries received less than 3 days before the team managers meeting for the World Championships will be refused if no preliminary entry and/or final entry are made prior. This decision cannot be appealed by the teams and is fully compliant with the current World Archery rules, article 3.7.1.2. Entries received after the deadlines, are subject to penalties as clearly stated in the rule book and the invitation documents of the World Championships. A Member Association that has made final entries in WAREOS and does not participate will be invoiced for the number of entries entered in the system, unless they have informed World Archery and the Organizing Committee in writing at least one week prior to the event that they are unable to attend.





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ACCOMMODATION & GENERAL INFORMATION

The official hotels are Best Western/Kelly Inn, Econolodge, Holiday Inn Express and Lewis & Clark Resort. Due to limited capacity a "First Come, First Serve" policy will be followed. All hotels are on the shuttle route. The accommodation cost will include breakfast and lunch. Dinner will be provided each night at the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center for an additional cost. If teams don't purchase the dinner option, they will be responsible for own meals and evening transportation to meals.

Teams who do not reserve their accommodation through the organizing committee will be charged a double entry fee.

- Reservations should be made on or before **13 May 2020**
- Final Hotel Reservation & Transportation on or before **08 July 2020**.

To confirm the reservation, a 60% deposit of the total amount is required to be bank transferred to the LOC on or before **15 June 2020**. Reservations after this date will be considered only according to availability.

IMPORTANT!

Please, note that there will be a limited number of rooms at each hotel. To ensure that you stay at your preferred hotel, please book your hotel as soon as possible. Reservations are only final after the LOC has received the deposit of 60%. Due to limited capacity a 'First Come, First Serve' policy will be followed. According to the availability of the rooms, the LOC reserves the right to direct the teams to the hotels of the same level. Most hotels do not have a restaurant, but dinner option is available each evening at the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center.

The hotel room rates are per room, per night, including Wi-Fi, breakfast at the hotels, lunch at the venues and local transportation.

In addition, the LOC will not be responsible to provide event information to any hotel not on the official accommodation list.

Teams that book non-official accommodation will need to register at the accreditation desk no later than the day before official practice day. Failing to do so will result in no changes being made to the entry list and it is likely that participation in the event will be refused if registration is not completed in time.

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ENTRY FEE

Entry fee:

Individual:	250 USD per athlete
Officials:	125 USD per person
Temporary Upgrade:	30 CHF per accreditation (For athletes wishing to be a coach temporarily)

Entry fee in NON-official hotels:

Individual:	500 USD per athlete
Officials:	250 USD per person

There is no entry fee for teams.

Entry fees include daily local transport to and from the practice field to/from official hotels during the qualification, elimination and finals venues (timetable to be confirmed on site).

PAYMENT CONDITIONS:

The entry fees should be paid in full before arrival.

To confirm hotel reservations, a minimum 50% deposit of the total amount is required to be bank transferred to the LOC before 14 June 2020. Reservations after this date will be considered only according to availability. The final outstanding balance shall be made via bank transfer before arrival. Accommodation cannot be guaranteed after this deadline. A balanced invoice will be provided via WAREOS.

Cancellations & Changes

All cancellations and changes must be made through WAREOS:

- Cancellations received before 14 August 2020 a full refund of the deposit payment will be made.
- Cancellations received after 14 August 2020; no refund will be given.
- Refunds will be processed after the event.
- Name changes to team officials or athletes (same category and division) will be accepted up to 17:00 hrs., two (2) days before official practice without any additional charge or penalty fees.
- Should flight arrival details change last minute, please contact the Organizing Committee using the details indicated in the team managers' booklet.
- If a participant's arrival is later than the original scheduled arrival date, the room will be charged from the date of the original booking in WAREOS.
- An email will automatically notify the Organizing Committee and Member Association of any changes made in WAREOS.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Transportation

Transportation will be provided from the two official airports:

Sioux Falls Regional (FSD) 80 mi /130 km from the venue, to the official hotels, two days before the official practice day and one day after the closing day.

Eppley Airfield in Omaha, NE (OMA) 156 mi / 251 km from the venue, to the official hotels, two days before the official practice day and one day after the closing day

The cost of this service is \$20 USD per person one way to/from Sioux Falls Airport and \$30 USD per person one way to/from Omaha Airport.

Local transport will be available between official hotels and archery venues. Transport timetables will be confirmed. Buses and/or vans will be provided.

Lunch at the venues

Lunch is included in hotel charge. Those signed up through official hotels will be provided a box lunch on qualification days. On practice, elimination and finals days – a warm lunch will be provided at the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center.





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Dinner

At an additional cost, teams can sign up for dinner service which will take place each evening at the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center. To order this option, teams should do so in advance on WAREOS. Charge each night for dinner at the center will be \$20.00 per person. Teams that don't sign up for dinner service at the complex will be responsible for their own meals and evening transportation to and from meals.

Banquet

The LOC will provide a Gala Dinner on Sunday 20th September. Please sign up in WAREOS if selecting this option. Price is \$40 USD per person.

Ceremonies

All ceremonies will take place at the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center. Details to be provided.

Water on the Venue

Bottled water will be available on the field free of charge.

Training

A training field will be available starting 12 September 2020. The training facility is at the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center. Teams who wish to arrive and practice earlier than this date, please contact the LOC directly to make arrangements. A fee of \$10.00 per day/per person will be charged and individuals will have access to both the indoor and outdoor facilities.

Weather

According to weather information, the average temperature in September is expected to be 60 to 80°F / 15 to 27°C.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING VISAS

Application for and obtaining travel visas to the United States are completely and solely the responsibility of the participating teams. A visa will be required of all visitors to enter the United States with the exception of Canada and the 38 nations that are part of the "Visa Waiver Program." The process for obtaining a visa requires each individual to submit an application through a U.S. Embassy or U.S. Consulate. This is a process that MUST be done by the applicant – the organizing committee cannot do it for you!

It is the applicants' responsibility for supplying the necessary information, ensuring all details are up to date, correct and submitted by the deadlines specified.

In addition, all participants that require a visa are kindly requested to supply a copy of their latest/valid passport. Copies of each applicate can be uploaded on WAREOS. All passport copies and personal details entered/uploaded to WAREOS will be held securely and in the strictest of confidence and not shared with other parties.

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ARCHERY VENUES:

**NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center
800 Archery Lane, Yankton, SD, 57078**



Yankton, South Dakota is the home of National Field Archery Association Foundation, and the first of the Easton Foundations Archery Centers. Situated on over 130 acres; the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center includes three outdoor field ranges, a 3D range, two FITA ranges, two 90m indoor ranges, two classrooms, a fitness studio, an art studio and the NFAA Foundation Archery Museum.

In 2007, Yankton beat out several Midwest cities to become the new headquarters' of the National Field Archery Association (NFAA). The original plan called for a 4,000 square foot office building to house the NFAA staff. In partnership with the NFAA Foundation, the Easton Foundations saw the opportunity to add on to the NFAA Headquarters and create a multi-million-dollar, state-of-the-art archery training facility. With incentives from the City of Yankton, the county and the state of South Dakota; the low cost made it impossible for the Easton Foundation to refuse. With that, the project grew to over 20,000 square feet.

In 2011 and again in 2017, the NFAA Foundation broke ground again with two separate expansion that added a combined 50,000 square feet and extended the building to include the World's first indoor 90-meter range and an archery distribution warehouse. The ranges have a combined 38 targets with 76 full-length shooting lanes, in a climate-controlled environment for year-round shooting. With movable targets, the range can be set up for shooting at any distance, and can accommodate as many as 80 targets for 18-meter (20 yard) tournaments.

Easton Field and First Dakota Field are 90-meter grass fields with room for a combined 130 targets and 260 shooting lanes. Awnings cover the entire width of the ranges, providing shade for the archers between ends, and a lawn behind the shooting line allows for spectators.





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Lewis & Clark Archery Field Range 43349 SD Hwy 52, Yankton, SD



Archers may take advantage of a 28-target NFAA (National Field Archery Association) certified archery range, as well as a practice range. The archery range is set up into two, 14-target rounds and is laid out in a wooded section of the park, giving archers a natural setting to enjoy their sport with an elevated shooting platform with a 6' and 12' level for shooting at 3D targets.

THE CITY OF YANKTON:

Yankton may be South Dakota's most historic town located on the northern bank of the Missouri River. Life in Yankton has always revolved around the Missouri River. Native Americans followed the river's flow to their destination's centuries ago. Citizens today use the river for various recreational activities that include: boating, fishing, kayaking and skiing.

This quaint town of almost 15,000 people has 14 parks with over 263 acres of green space. While in Yankton you will have to opportunity to experience the majestic beauty of the Meridian Bridge; the longest walking bridge in the United States that connects two states, South Dakota and Nebraska.

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Area Attractions:

Meridian Bridge and Meridian Plaza



The Meridian Bridge, a landmark in Yankton since 1924, is the result of hard work and determination of local citizens. The bridge closed to vehicle transportation in October 2008, but opened in November 2011 to foot traffic. The bridge welcomes both foot and bike traffic. Spanning over 3,209 feet, the Meridian Bridge is the longest pedestrian bridge connecting two states, Nebraska and South Dakota. It officially opened on October 11, 1924 and was the first permanent bridge crossing the Missouri River. This unique bridge is a “double-decker” with one lane positioned above another. It was constructed as a lift-span bridge to allow riverboat traffic to traverse the river. Up until 1953, it was operated as a toll bridge.

Yankton RiverWalk



RiverWalk is a public art project focused on bringing outdoor sculptures to downtown Yankton and Riverside Park. Volunteers of the non-profit work with artists and civic leaders to install and exhibit sculptures for the entire community to enjoy.





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Mead Cultural Education Center:



In 2018, the Dakota Territorial Museum relocated to the Mead Cultural Education Center, a historic building on the South Dakota Human Services Center Campus. Built in 1909, this building is a great addition to the wonderful collection the museum already holds. View the “Journeying Forward: Connecting Cultures with Lewis and Clark” exhibit – an in-depth look into Corps of Discovery’s journey west. The Children’s Transportation Museum offers kids of all ages the experience of what it was like to journey to Yankton by river, wagon, train, auto and plane.

The Meridian District:



Stroll through the downtown area and browse many individually owned and operated businesses and unique shops. You’ll discover specialty gift, clothing and antique shops, as well as art galleries, home furnishing, decorating and business services, food, drink and entertainment all to suit your needs. Historic downtown Yankton offers small town charm, unique architecture and area attractions and events all year round. Located along the Missouri River, just blocks away from historic neighborhoods, sites, museums and community parks.





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Missouri National Recreational River:



Did you know Yankton has a National Park? That's right, the Missouri National Recreational River runs right along Yankton's historic waterfront. Come discover beautiful stretches of the Missouri River with plenty of outdoor activities, including miles of trails for hiking, biking, running and paddling. Start your visit at Riverside Park where there are exhibits detailing the history of the Lewis & Clark Expedition, the steamboat era and the Dakota Territorial Capital. The Meridian Bridge offers a wonderful vantage point to look up and down the Recreational River's Wild and Scenic waters.
