TARGET AWARDS

As per Congress decision, new awards are now available. The details concerning the necessary scores to obtain such badges are mentioned below.

The new Target Award looks like this:

White, Black, Blue and Red awards are low value awards and cost USD 3/each +

in which the score where shot as they need to be registered (same registration as for World Records and other FITA stars, see below).

Member Associations will find enclosed with this mailing a form to use when ordering the target awards.

It is important to note that the awards will only be given the first time a score is shot in one of the five disciplines. For instance, if you shoot 675 points in a FITA 70m round and 585 points in a 25m indoor round, we will only send you 1 gold target award.

 - 18 meter FITA Indoor Round (60 arrows)

We would like to remind you of the process regarding the tournament registration.

"A Member Association intending to organise such a tournament must mail the announcement to the Secretary General at least one month before the first day of shooting. The awards can be gained at Tournaments organised by Member Associations and recognised by FITA for which each Member Association will pay a fee established by Council within the maximum amount established by Congress (USD 15 per tournament)".
