#### Mr. KAZIMIERZ FILIP

#### CONTINENTAL QUALIFICATION TOURNAMENT **OCEANIA**

The Oceania CQT took place 15-16 March 2000 in Suva, Fiji. Six places in total were to be attributed (3 to men and 3 to women).

However, only one female competitor took part in the competition. Therefore, the Executive Committee decided to allocate the places according to the rules to the 2 first stand-by places won at the Riom World Championships. This means that Sweden got the places and Oceania got no further stand by places.

#### **MISSING OF RANKING ROUND**

This is the unanimous statement from the Constitution & Rules Committee regarding missing competitor or team during the Ranking Round :

An accredited competitor or team not taking part in the Ranking Round of the Olympic Games Archery Tournament will be ranked last in the Ranking Round if he/she/they can provide satisfying proof (i.e. the statement of the doctor of the Olympic Village or an equivalent document) to the organisers (+TDs) before the end of the Ranking Round day that they were not able to take part in the Ranking Round due to circumstances beyond their control. In case of a team or more than one competitor from different nations being in that situation the ranking will be decided by random draw.

#### ARCHER IDENTIFICATION

Information for countries with archers participating in the Olympic Games :

We remind all Member Associations that it is mandatory for archers participating in the Olympic Games to have the archers last name and first initial, plus the 3 letter IOC Country Code on the upper back of their short or blouse. The archer's name should be above the country name code. Letter height should be from 5-7cm. The letters should be in a color to contrast with the short back and should be in the Roman Alphabet.

In case of long names we suggest to have a maximum of 14 characters and to abbreviate the name similar as it will be displayed on the big scoreboard.

#### TE (INTERPRETATION OF RULES It is a majority decision that : The AXIS riser is not allowed in the following divisions: - Barebow

- Standard
- for use in Ski/Archery

The AXIS riser is allowed in the following divisions :

- Recurve Bow
- Compound Bow

However the Technical Committee informs the FITA Member Associations and its Judges that if an archer is using systematically the back part of the riser (also called brace) as support to his arm he is using an additional support which is illegal according to the FITA Rules. The manufacturer has informed us that the brace was designed in such a way that there could be no contact of the archer's hand or wrist with the brace under normal shooting conditions and this has been tested and acknowledged by the technical

committee. It is illegal to artificially increase the size of this brace so that there would be a contact between the hand/wrist and the brace.

#### **TECHNICAL COMMITTEE II**

It is a majority decision that :

Bare Bow Division:

An arrow rest, which may be attached only to the sight window side of the riser, must remain mechanically and visually within the sight window area and not protrude across any portion of the belly (archers side) of the riser.

#### CONSTITUTION AND RULES COMMITTEE

It is the unanimous opinion of the C&R Committee that :

"All team members that have participated in the Team Elimination and Finals will receive a medal" This means that in order to receive a medal they will need to have shot at least during one end in the Olympic Round. If they are just in stand-by position they do not get a medal.

#### FITA ARROWHEADS

We trust all of you have received the new C&R book – version 2000. Unfortunately an error occurred in page 57 (article 6.3.6) with the description of the points necessary to obtain such awards. We show below the corrected tables. The corrections are shown in bold letters.
