CONSTITUTION & RULES

Rule Book

The 2004 Constitution & Rules Book (valid as of 1st April 2004) is now available on the FITA website, in its English version, under the link "Rule Book": http://www.archery.org/rule_book/rule_book.html.

FITA Office in liaison with the C&R Committee is currently working on the preparation of the paper printed and CD versions. French version will be also released in the next months.

ByLaws decisions

Please note that some of the bylaws decision made at the December 2003 FITA Council meeting in Lausanne are immediately effective, whereas others will be effective as of 1st April 2004 or later. This is the reason why these decisions are currently published with both 2002 and 2004 Rule Book.

Interpretations

Book 1, Art. 1.5.7.1

If the President ceases to hold this office or in the event of his or her inability or refusal to act, the First Vice President shall perform the duties of the President for the remainder of his or her term, in the case of the President ceasing to hold office, or during such period of his inability or refusal to act, as applicable.

If the First Vice President ceases to hold this office or in the event of his or her inability or refusal to act, the Vice President (selected as determined in the following sentence), shall perform the duties of the First Vice President for the remainder of his or her term, in the case of the First Vice President ceasing to hold office, or during such period of his or her inability or refusal to act, as applicable. The Vice President to assume such duties shall be the then acting Vice President with the longest continuous period of service in that office (with only the period of continual service counted in reverse from the date of the vacancy to be filled being considered). If two or more then acting Vice President's have the same periods of continual service, the Vice President who received the highest number of votes in the first ballot at the Congress when both Vice President's were elected shall assume such duties.

Ski Archery

The international ski/archery season has started on 10 and 11 January in Prémanon, France, where the first event of the 2004 World Cup was held. This event was coupled with the National French Championships in this discipline. Currently ski/archery is organized by the International Biathlon Union (IBU), in partnership with FITA. The World Championships will be held end of February in Pokljuka, Slovenia, and there will be also a ski/archery IBU/FITA Committee meeting at this time.

Anti-Doping News

The new FITA anti-rules, in conformity with the World Anti-Doping Code, has been published in its English version on the FITA website, in new webpage which has been specially built up for anti-doping news. These rules will come into effect as of 1st April 2004.

All Member Associations are invited to read them and adapt their own national rules accordingly, before 13th August 2004. More detailed information on main changes will be released soon.

Among the next important steps at FITA level there will be:

- The implementation of the testing pool (Member Associations who have athletes concerned will be directly contacted soon).
- The setting up of the two new anti-doping related FITA Committees (Therapeutic Use Exemptions Committee and Anti-Doping Committee). This topic will be on the agenda of the forthcoming Medical Committee meeting on 14th February.
- The implementation of the out of competition testing programme
- The publication of the French version of the rules.

On January 23, a delegation of 9 representatives from the National Olympic Committee of Barbados, including IOC Member Mr Austin Sealy, NOC President Mr Steve Route, and Secretary General Mr Erskine Simmons, paid a visit to the FITA Office in Lausanne. It was welcomed by Pascal Colmaire, Technical and Training Director, and Françoise Dagouret, Project Director.

Among the topics discussed was the Olympic qualification system in the sport of archery, the implementation of the new World Anti-Doping Code and the organization and development of sport in the Carribeans.

Barbados NOC showed that it is very attentive to the needs of their National Federations and FITA expressed its grateful thanks for that support, as its Member Association in Barbados is one of the most active in its area.

Questions & Answers

AGE RULE

There have been several situations where Cadet archers shoot Cadet compound, Junior compound, and Senior compound in the same FITA Star Tournament. I was wondering if this is legal.

C&R Committee Chairman: FITA does not have age limits now that restrict cadet participation or cadet rights as competitors (see C&R Book 1, Chapter 4, Art. 4.3.2.1). In order to protect young competitors, however, the cadet class has been introduced with a large cadet competition program (restricted to that age group). Please see new rules on this (2004 edition of our Rule Book). The intention is to offer cadet competitions where cadets can compete among their equals. These competitions do not require adult equipment but equipment adjusted to their age group.
