#### **MEDICAL COMMITTEE**

The annual FITA Medical Committee meeting chaired by Dr. Karol Hibner was held on 14th and15th February in Istanbul, Turkey.

Special thanks are addressed to Turkish MC Member Dr. Emin Ergen for his assistance in the organization of this meeting. Despite exceptional weather conditions in Istanbul (the closing of the airport on the day when the participants from Europe were to arrive, due to heavy snow storm), all agenda items were covered, thanks to the determination of highly dedicated MC members who committed themselves to work overnight.

Among topics discussed were the publication of a FITA Medical and Scientific Manual, anti-doping matters, anti-doping controls and workshops at FITA events. More details on different projects and activities will be released in next *FITA INFO* issues.

#### **APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP**

The Commonwealth of Dominica has applied to the FITA membership.

This country has submitted a membership application file conformed to our rule 1.4.2. According to our rule 1.4.3 the current FITA Member Associations and the members of the FITA Council have 60 days to raise in writing to the FITA office any objection to this request of membership.

Without any serious objection within these 60 days (April 30, 2004), a temporary FITA membership will be granted to the Dominica Archery Association until our June 2005 Congress in Madrid. The final membership of this National Archery Association will be submitted to a vote during this FITA Congress.

# Athens 2004

#### A STADIUM OVER 2,300 YEARS OLD

In a few months archery athletes who have successfully made it to the Olympic Games in Athens will have the unique chance of competing in the Panathinaiko Stadium where the first Olympic Games of the modern area took place and which was built on the ruins of an ancient stadium built in 329 B.C.

#### The best venue

"I think we have the best venue of them all!" Jim Easton, President of the International Archery Federation (FITA), said. "The staging of our sport in such a historic place will certainly add something very special. The Olympic Games in themselves are already a unique occasion for an athlete, so adding this extra dimension of being able to compete in this beautiful marble stadium where the first Games of the modern era took place - well, you could say it marks yet another place in history, one which I am sure each athlete will treasure. And no doubt it will be very special for the spectators, both on-site and watching on the TV networks around the world. I believe we will be able to put on a show worthy of the venue - something which will make everyone very proud."



#### Narrower field

The Archery Federation had to adapt to this unique place, however. "We were pleased that the test event went very well. We had to modify some of our usual procedures because the field is narrower than we have used in previous Olympic Games. When there were small things we had to change, the organisers were very cooperative."

#### From strong to no wind

The conditions in the stadium during the test event in August 2003 were extremely changeable: "We had a good mix of what could happen at Games time: strong winds, medium winds, or no wind at all, and higher temperatures. And in each case, things worked well."

#### Impressive volunteers

A stadium and an event also rely on the people working and competing there. Easton is full of admiration for the volunteers: "The venue management team was good and the people worked hard to do their jobs. What perhaps impressed me most was that the volunteers were clearly out to prove something for their country and I believe that is very important. They want to put on very well-organised Games in Athens which will make all Greek people proud. I could see that drive in every one of them."
