

### **Sportel Shanghai**

#### FITA at the Sportel for the first time in its history

Sportel is the biggest televisions and images fair, where right owners such as sports federations or agencies come together with TV stations,

TV website, mobile phone companies to buy, sell, and distribute their sporting images.



In order to promote the TV highlights of its new World Cup, FITA was among the new comer and sent a strong delegation composed of its Marketing and Communication Director Didier Mieville, its TV Consultant Dominique Curchod and Koray Eti, representing Meteksan as FITA's sponsor and TV graphics provider.

To be recognized as a brand-name and be associated with sponsors, Archery must be seen. The most important medium is still TV. In Shanghai, FITA has made key contacts and negotiations with major continental TV channels such as Eurosport, Fox Sport International, ESPN Star Asia and also national TV stations such as Korean Broadcasting System Sky, Chinese Television (CCTV), Fox Sport Australia and many more around the world.

FITA also confirmed the distribution process with the EBU worldwide network. FITA's demo DVD with modern, animated, 3D TV graphics provided by Meteksan-MSL has been well received and we can consider this presence at Sportel Shanghai as a very important step to see quality Archery on TV and to start building the brand of Archery.

### **FITA Office Workshop**

#### Setting higher standards

In March the FITA President invited all members of the Office to Turkey for a quality workshop weekend on "service quality" under the direction of TSE Consulting, as well as a presentation of quality improvement programmes by Haceteppe University Hospitals.

All the employees of the FITA Office actively took part in this seminar to define their working values, the way to communicate them and apply them to a high quality service as an International Sport Federation. Thanks to the reflective and the practical sessions of the workshop, the FITA Office will further improve and document its working principles and review its corporate identity. Many changes will take place in the months to come. The move in July to the International House of Sport in Lausanne will be a catalyst and a key milestone in the project.

### **Anti-Doping**



### **Annual Symposium for International Federations**

The FITA Office Coordinator Chantal Steiner, the Administration & Legal Director Françoise Dagouret and the Secretary General Tom Dielen have attended the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) annual Symposium for International Federations (IFs) and National Anti-Doping Agencies (NADOs), on 30 and 31 March in Lausanne.

FITA had the opportunity to present its athletes whereabouts management system, being currently one of the 7 IFs to actually implement the WADA Anti-Doping Administration and Management System (ADAMS) with its own athletes. In the next weeks, FITA will even go one step further with the implementation of ADAMS in the areas of the whereabouts non conformities, the missed tests and the Therapeutic Use Exemptions (TUEs), in liaison with WADA and its testing service provider IDTM.

This symposium allowed many individual contacts with stakeholders from the NADOs, in order to set up a better cooperation in the day to day anti-doping operations, and the areas of Out of Competition tests.

In addition, the latest updates were given on the WADA projects and activities, including IFs Anti-Doping Programme Development and Regional Anti-Doping Organisations (RADOs), in which FITA has shown its greatest interest. WADA also announced the publication of medical guidelines for TUEs Committee members in order to get a better harmonization in the various policies regarding TUE applications management among nations and IFs.

### **Archery Development**

#### Bamboo archery equipment workshop for Africa

The new FITA program "Make your archery equipment yourself" will experiment one important step on May 8-12, 2006 in Cotonou (Benin), with a making workshop of archery equipment from bamboo.

Getting archery equipment is an issue for several countries. Some years ago, India decided to create an "indigenous" equipment division, i.e. using items that anyone could make. Indian people have mainly used bamboo for the bow limbs and arrows. India is nowadays one of the most competitive archery countries.

FITA wishes to give a fair try to the duplication of the Indian successful example in other places. Africa has been chosen. Paul ZINSOU, the new FITA Development Agent for West Africa is coordinating this project. An Indian bowmaker will conduct the workshop. FITA invites one representative from each African Member Association; additional participants will be at their own.

### Athlete Scholarship Program

### "Viva America" for 2006 Junior World Championships

FITA will receive support from Justice for Athletes (JFA) for the 2006 World Junior Championships. JFA is granting the amount of 26,400\$ for a World Junior Championships Scholarship Program – "Viva America" to be held October 12-21, 2006 in Mexico. FITA will also give the amount of \$26,400 to this program.

JFA's goal in supporting the young archers is to enable underprivileged youth from developing countries to become role models for other youth by allowing them to participate in an elite level training facility and having the opportunity to both improve their individual abilities and also promote the ideals of sportsmanship, ethics and fair play in their home countries.

FITA is very happy with the support of JFA and believes this gives a tremendous opportunity for the young archers in the Americas to learn from a highly ethical and competitive program. FITA hopes that the selected archers will enjoy their experience and that it will help them with the archery endeavors as wells as their lives.

The Estonian report is very positive, they have enjoyed the following:

- Good coach (Mr. KIM Jeong-Ho)
- > Different free sporting opportunities: archery, running, swimming, gym, tennis, horse riding, squash, football, cricket etc.
- > Good climate- you can shoot outside in the early spring (and even all year long)
- Good conditions for longer camp- not too many distracting attractions in the club, but if you want to do sightseeing (pyramids, museums, citadel) or see some kind of entertainment, you can get to the city center with 10 minutes.
- Local people are kind to help you to organize your free day.
- Possibility to use Internet
- Possibility to have massage (half an hour €7.25 or US\$8.75, an hour €11.50 or US\$14).
- > Different but interesting culture.
- ➤ If you pay 35\$ per person/one night, you will have plenty of money to eat. If you are not used to eat much, you will even have spare money.
- Different places where you can eat: restaurant, café, snack bar by the pool...
- > It is quite safe on club's territory.
- > There is a money exchange and small shops in the club.

As conclusion of their report the Estonian delegation wrote: "Wadi Degla Sporting Club is a good place with different opportunities for training camp. The area is safe and secured. The catering, accommodation and sport facilities are provided. We believe that it will be excellent place for archers when the new archery field is ready."

### **Results from Asia**

### First South Asian Archery Championship

The South Asian Archery Federation (SAAF) was formed in November 2005 with a view to develop the sports of archery in the South Asian Region. The SAAF comprises Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka, all members of FITA and AAF (Asian Archery Federation). Maldives has not yet formed an Archery Association.

The 1st South Asian Archery Championship was then held in Bangladesh on 8-11 February 2006 with the participation of 5 nations, namely Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal and Sri Lanka.

Among the personalities present were Mr. Rahin Datta, Chairman of FITA Development and Technical Assistance Committee, and Mr. Paresh Nath Mukherjee, Vice President of the Asian Archery Federation.

### FAQ - Laws, Bylaws

Rules status with regard to Laws and Bylaws

#### Question:

How to differentiate the status of a rule with regard to Laws and bylaws, in particular in the Rule Book appendixes?

#### Answer:

As a general principle for the FITA Constitution & Rules Book, rules in normal prints are laws, rules in italic prints are bylaws. This applies to the core parts of Books 1, 2, 3 and 4. Below is shown the details for the Appendixes and Book 5.

Be knowledgeable and have experience in the sport of archery, preferably as a coach.
