Publication of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) **2008 Prohibited List**

The 2008 List of WADA prohibited substances and methods is now available on the WADA website www.wada-ama.org in the "Prohibited List" link. It will come into effect as of 1 January 2008.

The major change in the new list includes the concept of "atypical" result, which has been introduced in the case of an initial result for an endogenous anabolic steroid triggers additional investigations in order to determine the endogenous or exogenous origin of the substance. In such case the sample will be reported by the laboratory as "atypical" and not "adverse".

Development

World Coaching Seminar

The 3rd FITA World Coaching Seminar will be held in Goesan city (South Korea) on 22-26 October 2007. The seminar is only focussing on the recurve bow. The following changes have been made to the program and organization:

- > The famous champion Ms Lee Eun-Kyung will replace Mr Oh Sun-Tek. She will present her experience in tournament preparation and shooting exercise.
- The organizing committee has arranged a special transportation from Incheon airport to Goesan city (site of the seminar), for a very good price. Hence there is no need to travel by public bus anymore.
- The FITA Secretary General will attend and give a presentation.
- Close to 90 participants are already registered.
- > The new registration deadline is **5 October 2007**.

Training Camp for young Russian speaking archers

At the initiative of the FITA President, Dr Ugur Erdener, a program was designed in order to enhance Archery within the Russian speaking countries. The project targets three major development activities, namely Coaching, Judging and the Athletes themselves. A Judging seminar in April 2007 was followed by a Coaching seminar in May (both in Antalya, Turkey), and a Youth Training Camp was held in Ankara.

The Youth Training Camp has finished on Sunday 23 September with a total of 25 participants from 10 countries. The experts on site for the training camp were Mr Andre Korlaar, Mr Vladimir Esheev, Mr Sasha Svedziantsou and Mr Vladimer Lekveishvili.

Assistance to national structures

COPARCO will assist some countries in improving their archery structure by:

News from the South Asia Archery Federation

The SAAF has planned to start Archery with bamboo bows. India and Bangladesh have already started. Ten (10) sets of equipment have been offered to Nepal and Sri Lanka during a Training Program. The same will apply to Bhutan in the near future.

FITA and Olympic Solidarity Scholarships for Coaches' Education at the FITA MEAC

In close coordination with Olympic Solidarity, FITA has started organizing coaching education courses at the FITA Middle East Archery Training Centre (MEAC) in Cairo, Egypt. For this purpose, the Continental Archery Associations suggested at the beginning of 2007 a number of coaches that they would like to educate depending on their development strategy.

The courses are based on the number of coaches and their level (1, 2 or 3). Priority has been given to coaches from FITA Member Associations with the greatest needs (i.e. countries that had never attended international events or Olympic Games).

The "Olympic Solidarity Scholarship Program - Sport Specific Training for coaches" finances most of the coaches attending this course. As per an agreement between FITA and Olympic Solidarity, for every country having two participants the FITA Foundation will financially support one of the coaches. In addition, the FITA Foundation might offer a Level 1 Equipment Kit to the countries participating in this course, after a review of their development program.

A 1-month Olympic Solidarity scholarship for three coaches

The first three coaches selected for this project are about to complete the course at the MEAC. They come from Oceania (Papua New Guinea) and from Asia (Malaysia and Hong Kong, China).

A 1-month Olympic Solidarity scholarship for more than 10 coaches

From 8 October to 7 November a new group of coaches will be attending a coaching course in Cairo. This group includes coaches from Africa (Mauritius, Chad, Tunisia, and South Africa), the Americas (Puerto Rico, Cuba and Guatemala), Asia (Thailand and Bhutan), and Oceania (Solomon Island and Vanuatu).

Assistance to the African Countries for attending their CQT

The FIDTA foundation has established a program enabling more African archers to participate at the African Continental Qualifying Tournament (CQT) to be held in Cairo, Egypt on 7-10 February 2008. Only six archers and one coach from three countries applied for this program within the deadline. FITA has decided to extend the application deadline to 14 October 2007.

If we do not received enough applications to select 18 archers and 10 coaches, the FIDTA could consider dropping this assistance program to the African countries. The description of this program has been resent to all the African Member Associations.















Archery at the 2009 Mediterranean Games

In order to maintain and strengthen archery within the Mediterranean Games Program, the FIDTA Foundation will help several countries from this region to prepare the 2009 event to be held in Pescara, Italy through:

- > A training camp at the FITA Middle East Archery Centre;
- Partial assistance for travel and participation;
- > Donation of archery equipment to some selected archers.

In a near future the FIDTA will make a call to the relevant Mediterranean Member Associations to submit applications for archers within the profile above mentioned. The deadline for submission will be 31 December 2007.

UNICEF and GNAS assist India

A 5-year development plan has started focussing on the grass roots in rural areas (clubs and competitive leagues around rural villages and right across the country), girls' involvement and developing disability sport opportunities in India.

UNICEF is using Lakshmi - a phenomenal girl archer from a poor tribal background in Jharkhand state - as one of their "Girl Star" icons in a campaign they are currently running around female empowerment. This program will also encourage local equipment production, which reduces shipping costs, taxes, etc. and empowers communities and local economies.

News from Nepal

The South Asian Archery Federation Development Committee, in collaboration with Nepal Archery Association, organized a bamboo bow seminar in Katmandu and Pokra on 15-18 August and 19-21 August, respectively. This seminar included two parts: "How to make a Bamboo Bow" and "Training to shoot with a Bamboo Bow". Sixty people attended the seminar, including traditional archers, first-time archers and various schools.

Twelve people attended a Judges Seminar that was conducted in Katmandu, Nepal on 12-14 August. Mr Rathin Datta, 1st Vice President and Chairman of the Development and Technical Committee of the South Asian Archery Federation (SAAF), was the course conductor.

Pakistan

FITA is in contact with some people who are willing to revive the National Archery Federation of Pakistan. Any Member Association that could assist in this project is invited to contact the FITA Development Director, Mr Pascal Colmaire (pcolmaire@archery.org).

Level 2 Coaching Course in Portugal

One of the EMAU priorities is to give assistance in education to the Member Associations that still have a low level of activities in order to raise their competitive level. EMAU has therefore set up a project of Level 1, 2 and 3 Coaching Courses.

EMAU has planned to organize a 3-day Coaching Course in Portugal, conducted by Mario Codispoti. It will contain equipment knowledge and tuning. It is a follow-up seminar for the participants the 1-part Level 1 Course in 2005 and 2006. An EMAU Certificate as club coaches will be given to the qualified participants. It will be followed next year by the final Level 3 Course for those who will have participated in the Level 2 Course. This seminar will include an education on Sport Medicine, Psychology and Mental in Archery Performance and on the FITA Rules.

Samoa

The FITA Development Agent in Oceania has finished a 1-month mission in Samoa.

Ken Bearman, FITA Coaches Committee Chairman, is running a mission in Sri Lanka from 23 September to 3 October. The program includes working with their national team as well as with intermediate archers.















Olympic Solidarity Course for Coaches in Argentina

Pascal Colmaire, FITA Development and Coaching Education Director, has conducted a successful course for Level 2 coaches in Buenos Aires, Argentina on 2-7 September 2007. Twelve coaches and the National team attended this course.

Archery starts in Benin

As announced in the previous issue of this newsletter, Benin wishes to join the FITA family. This young National Archery Federation is currently benefiting from an Olympic Solidarity Program entitled "Development of the National Structure" (20 August-5 October 2007) with a financial support of US\$ 25,000. Paul Zinsou, FITA Development Agent for West Africa, is running this program. He has been teaching how to make archery equipment from bamboo and educating Level 1 coaches in the different regions.

Togo and Niger

Following the above project in Benin, Paul Zinsou will conduct a similar program in Togo and Niger, both funded by the Olympic Solidarity. He will work about one week in the geographical departments selected by each National Olympic Committee.

Uganda

A British archery coach - Mr Daryn Radcliffe - is currently running an Olympic Solidarity Program entitled "Development of the National Structure" in Uganda. This programme will last six months and is focussed on training a group of 25 local coaches and assisting the development of archery. Mr Daryn Radcliffe has collected some archery equipment from UK for the Uganda Archery Federation. He is teaching the Ugandans in bow making from domestic resources.

Cyprus cares for its archery coaches

The Olympic Solidarity has allocated a budget of US\$ 3,500 to the NOC of Cyprus for implementing a technical course for archery coaches in 2007 (probably in November). A Level 2 Archery Coach Course Conductor is needed for this course. Applications can be made to:




