This decision has led to the disqualification of the Athlete's results in the 2007 Trofeo Ciudad de Lleida.

Resignation of Renaud Baudrillart as FITA Development Agent in Oceania

For facing new challenges, Renaud resigned from the position of FITA Development Agent for the Oceania in February 2008. Renaud took this job in April 2007. He went to some islands where he helped them during more than one month to increase their archery standards and structure. Renaud's services and performance were well appreciated.

FITA is consulting the Oceania National Olympic Committees (ONOC) and the Oceania Archery Confederation (OAC) to consider his replacement.













FITA Middle East Archery Centre Activities

February was a busy month at the FITA Middle East Archery Centre (MEAC) with a training camp for various African countries, a Judging Course, the African Championship and Continental Qualification Tournament for the Olympic Games, a meeting of the FITA Coaches Committee (see above), a Coaching Course and a training camp for the Italian pre-Olympic team.

In March the following National Teams are scheduled: Finland, Hungary and Poland.

Training camp, African Championships and Continental Qualification Tournament

After the successful partnership between FIDTA (Fondation Internationale de Tir à l'Arc), "Justice for Athlete" and FITA allowing the highest number of Latin-Americans ever to take part to the 2006 World Youth Championship in Merida (Mexico), a new project has been implemented in February 2008. These three parties decided to help archers from Africa in preparing and attending their Continental Championship, which was also their Qualifying Tournament to the 2008 Olympic Games.

The preparation was organized through a two week training camp in the FITA Middle East Archery Centre (MEAC), located in Cairo (Egypt). One female archer, one male archer and one coach were invited to this camp run by the new MEAC Coach, Mr Mun Baek Woon. All their expenses were paid: travel, visa, local transport, hotel, meals and training expenses. This camp was hold just before a twofold tournament: the Championship of Africa and the Continental Qualifying Tournament to the 2008 Olympic Games. This event was also organized in Wadi Degla Sporting Club, where is located the FITA MEAC. It was the best ever archery tournament organized in Africa! Congratulations to Mr Aladin GABR, President of the Egyptian Archery Federation and his organizing team! Due to the above described assistance, it has been the biggest Archery African Championship ever. Furthermore the three top women and men met the Minimum Qualifying Score for the 2008 Olympic Games; something never seen in Africa!



Without the tremendous assistance of Justice for Athletes, such achievements would never have been possible; hence our deepest thanks to this foundation.


The course has followed the FITA Level 1 Coaching Manual enriched of the experience of the lecturers, particularly from KIM Hyung-Tak.

Constitution & Rules

Rules Book

A new version of the rule book which including all the changes since the Madrid and Leipzig Congresses, coming into effect on 1 April of this year, has been published on the FITA website in the section Rules / Constitution & Rules. For the moment only the English version is available, but the French will be available before 1 April.

A call was made earlier for comments or corrections, and the final version will be published in the first days of March. Only an electronic version will be available but it is available for download from the web. Also, it has been made that you can only replace the pages affected of the 2006 edition. The new printed version will be the 2010 edition which is planned to be a complete revision of the book as part of the project to make the rule book easier for access and use.

We want to stress that up until 1 April 2008 this new edition of the book is not fully in effect since some of the partially underlined bylaws come into effect on that day. Therefore, for the moment we recommend using the 2006 edition with the approved bylaws as addition especially in Field competitions.

Erratum

A mistake has been made in the English version of the bylaw concerning Book 4, Article 9.8.2.2, approved by FITA Council on 10 November 2007, effective as of 1 April 2008, and published in the January 2008 issue of FITA Info. This bylaw should read as follows:

9.8.2.2

A Judge, timing an athlete and observing him exceed the <u>3</u>-minute time limit, will caution him <u>verbally and confirm this warning</u> by a signed note on the scorecard, indicating the time of the warning. At the second and all subsequent warnings during that stage of the competition, the athlete's <u>highest</u> scoring arrow at the target will be forfeited (9.5.1.12).




