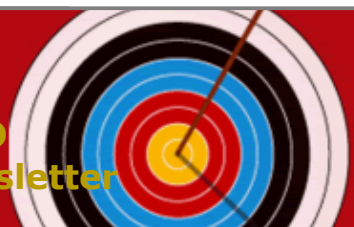

June 2008

### FITA President nominated

At the IOC Executive Board in Athens, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) has decided to put forward the FITA President, Dr Ugur Erdener from Turkey, as a candidate for the IOC Membership. The other nominee is Mr Sergey Bubka from Ukraine.



Dr Erdener is the second FITA President to be nominated for the IOC Membership but it is the first time in the capacity as IF President. Our Honorary President, Mr James L. Easton, was appointed as an individual member at the IOC Session in Paris in 1994.

FITA is delighted with this news and now awaits the decision at the next IOC Session in Beijing in August.

### Information about Quota Places for Olympic Games

On Wednesday 25 June, the National Olympic Committees (NOCs) of Belgium and the Netherlands informed FITA that they rejected the places obtained because the archers concerned did not fulfil their internal criteria.

FITA regrets this decision but under the Olympic Charter it is the NOCs responsibility to accept quota places. We are convinced that these talented archers will compete at future Olympic Games. Wietse van Alten (NED) has already shown with his bronze medal in Sydney that he deserves to be at the Olympics. FITA will discuss with the respective NOCs how we can avoid such scenarios in the future and will also address the IOC in relation to the way the qualification system will work for London 2012.

The returned places have been allocated to Venezuela, Canada and Belarus for the women and to Germany for the men. The respective NOCs have now until 4 July to accept these places.

The current list of selected athletes for the Olympic Games 2008 in Beijing is available as an appendix at the end of this newsletter.

### Substitutions at the Olympics

The final deadline for names entries for Beijing 2008 is set on 23 July 2008. After this date only changes for medical reasons confirmed by the IOC and FITA are possible until the team captains meeting on 7 August.

### FIDTA: Assistance to Olympic Archers

The May 2008 issue of the FITA INFO informed you of the International Foundation for the Development of Archery (FIDTA) Board meeting approving the assistance programme for 10 archers in the preparation for the Olympic Games. The following projects were immediately established:

- Véronique d'Unienville (MRI) will receive a full kit of archery equipment and she is being trained by the South African coach Joseph Preisser.
- Ali Adnan (IRQ) is training for one month and a half at the KIM Hyung-Tak training centre in South Korea.

## Clean Sport

### Participation in the Olympic Games - Rules 45 of the Olympic Charter (OC)

On 27 June the International Olympic Committee (IOC) issued a document entitled "Regulations regarding Participation in the Olympic Games – Rules 45 of the Olympic Charter" which was approved by the IOC Executive Board at its meeting in Athens earlier in the month. These regulations have now entered into force and will apply to anti-doping rule violations committed as of 1 July 2008.

In summary, if a person is sanctioned by a suspension of more than six months by any anti-doping organization for any violation of any anti-doping regulations, that person may not participate, in any capacity, in the next edition of the Games of the Olympiad and of the Olympic Winter Games following the date of expiry of such suspension.

The IOC Executive Board has taken this decision in furtherance of the fight against doping.

The IOC Executive Board, in accordance with Rules 19.3.10 OC and pursuant to Rule 45 OC, hereby issues the following rules regarding participation in the Olympic Games:

1. Any person who has been sanctioned with a suspension of more than six months by any anti-doping organization for any violation of any anti-doping regulations may not participate, in any capacity, in the next edition of the Games of the Olympiad and of the Olympic Winter Games following the date of expiry of such suspension.
2. These Regulations apply to violations of any anti-doping regulations that are committed as of 1 July 2008. They are notified to all International Federations, to all National Olympic Committees and to all Organising Committees for the Olympic Games.

### Registered Testing Pool

The FITA Registered Testing Pool (RTP) of those athletes who are required to provide whereabouts information to FITA has been updated. It takes into account the athletes selected in the National Archery Olympic Team at the Beijing Olympic Games. These new athletes are:

The updated Registered Testing Pool can be downloaded from the section Clean Sport/Registered Testing Pool of our website. In the next days it will be updated again with the most recently data, in particular those ones winning places at the World Olympic Qualification Tournament held on 26 June 2008 and confirmed by their National Olympic Committee.

### Anti-Doping Procedures applicable at International Master Events

The International Masters Games Association (IMGGA) informed us that the applicable anti-doping procedures for the European Masters Games (Malmö, Sweden, 29 August-9 September 2008) and the World Masters Games (Sydney, Australia, 11-17 October 2009) will be as briefly summarized below:

1. The principle of retroactive Therapeutic Use Exemptions (TUE) will be applied for all substances, in agreement with the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA). This means there is no need to apply for a TUE prior to the event. In case of a positive test, the athlete concerned will have to submit the medical prescription for the substance found to a Medical Board who will decide if this is acceptable or not.

2. In the case the medical prescription is not recognized by the Medical Board, the case will then be submitted to a Disciplinary Board for adjudication (for sanctions applicable with regard to the event) and, for the FITA affiliated members, to FITA, for consideration of further sanctions according to the FITA and WADA anti-doping rules.

## FITA Committees

### IMAP Committee Meeting

The ad hoc Image Media and Archery Presentation Committee, IMAP Committee, met on 1 June 2008 after the World Cup Stage 3 in Antalya, Turkey. The IMAP Committee looks at the broad picture of Archery and FITA and makes recommendations to Council concerning—image, branding strategy, communications strategy, FITA publications, presentation, promotion, distribution, and media.

During the meeting we reviewed accomplished goals and proposals for the future. The more important topics and suggestions discussed include:

- The importance of maintaining a high level of professionalism and consistency for all types of media;
- The new Archery World Cup logo;
- The World Cup trophy;
- Televised archery with news reports, highlights and live coverage: successful distribution and suggestion to get some income from television promotion. The details of this program of sharing television costs are being studied.
- The highly successful YouTube platform;
- The FITA website might hold interactive activities which would qualify participants for awards.
- The promotion remains the one area requiring the most improvement.



Other projects in the works include:

- A FITA Style booklet, which would standardize preferred terminology, spelling and style; and include information about FITA and the Archery World Cup.
- Website improvements such as statistics, results and direct news that could be sent directly.
- New publications such as the Target, Coach's Manual Level 2, Organiser's Manual, Branding Manual, Officers and Official Guidebook.

In conclusion, the IMAP Committee identified and discussed specific actions for the future of FITA and Archery. Thanks to the talented and passionate FITA team, for their efforts toward the realization of the goals; and to the FITA volunteers for their valuable time and expertise.

## Development

### Olympic Solidarity Coaching Course

The Dominica Archery Federation will host a technical course for coaches from the 13 to 28 July 2008 thanks to the support of the Olympic Solidarity and the National Olympic Committee. Sheri Rhodes (USA) has been appointed by the FITA Coaches Committee to conduct the course. It will gather 51 participants including 4 women. Further information will follow in a coming edition.

### Training Camp in the Solomon Islands

The FITA Development Department was informed that the Solomon Islands National Development Officer, Mr Daniel Fa'Alimea, will organise a 1-month training camp thanks to the support of the Oceania National Olympic Committee (ONOC).

The national federation noticed a great potential among the archers and coaches who participated in the South Pacific Games and thinks it requires further development and training. Therefore, the federation applied for assistance to ONOC in order to organise this training camp before the National Games at the end of 2008.

FITA would like to congratulate the Archery Federation of Blong Solomon Islands for putting in place such a project and demonstrating the importance of keeping a good relationship with its Continental Olympic Association.

### New Club in North East Brazil

After marrying a Brazilian woman, a French archery fanatic called Christian Barbé had the idea of creating a club in the city of Bananeiras in the Brazilian state of Paraiba. Experiencing some difficulties with finding archery material on sight Christian Barbé contacted two archery clubs in France so that he could receive some equipment to start off the new club. Despite the difficulties and thanks to the generosity of those two clubs and to the perseverance of Christian some equipment could be dispatched to Bananeiras.



Knowing the difficulties experienced by Christian Barbé, FITA and the National Olympic Committee of Brazil have agreed to find a solution for all matters related to equipment shipping. FITA would like to thank Christian for his great initiative and dedication to the development of archery.

Built in 1908, the Montbenon Casino enjoys a unique situation in Lausanne. A walking distance to the city centre and surrounded by beautiful gardens it offers an unrestricted view over the Geneva Lake and the mountains. The building was renovated in 1981 and has become a place for social and cultural entertainment. Contrary to what its name implies, the Casino has never housed games rooms.

### Field World Championships 2008: Situation with Entries

The Field World Championships 2008 will have a competition in the following categories: Recurve Men, Recurve Women, Compound Men, Compound Women, Barebow Men, Barebow Women, Team Men, Team Women, Recurve Junior Men, Recurve Junior Women, Compound Junior Men.

Following article 3.7.4 of the Constitution and Rules Book the World Championships will not be held for:

- Compound Junior Women – 5 entries
- Barebow Junior Men – 3 entries
- Barebow Junior Women – 3 entries
- Team Junior Women – 2 entries
- Team Junior Men – 2 entries

The organizing committee will host a special event for these categories but no title or medal will be awarded in these events. Our Member Associations concerned have been informed as well.

### Youth World Championships 2008

For the Youth World Championships 2008 the minimum number of entries per category has been reached. Therefore, there will be an event in all categories.

Please note that the ages divisions are the following:

- For the Junior Event anyone who is born on the 1/1/1990 or after.
- For the Cadet Event anyone who is born on the 1/1/1992 or after.

Cadets can participate in the Junior event.

A team can only be composed of archers competing in the same event.

The 2008 Australian Open to be held in Diamond Valley, Australia, on 17-19 October will be recognized as a World Ranking Tournament.

### **Book 2, Article 7.6.5.2**

### **Book 3, Articles 8.6.5.1 & 8.6.5.2**

*Some questions were raised by a FITA Member Association on ties for entries to the Elimination Round.*

The Constitution and Rules Committee finds that the questions presented to be within the terms of reference of the Target Archery Committee.

The Constitution and Rules Committee has determined that the following interpretations of the Target Archery Committee are not contrary to the existing rules or Congress decisions.

#### **Responses from the Target Archery Committee:**

##### *Question 1:*

*What are the target arrangements to be used for breaking of ties for entrance to the Elimination Rounds when the FITA 70 meter Round (or the FITA 60 meter Round for Cadets) is used for the qualification round? Are they the same as expressed in Book 2, 7.6.5.2.1 after the outdoor target round with the exception that the 70 meter or 60 meter distance is used?*

Response:

Yes, it will be the last distance shot and the provisions will be the same in terms of the target being neutral. For a team, they will shoot one target per team.

##### *Question 2:*

*When a FITA Outdoor Target Archery Round is shot as a qualification round in reverse order (shortest distance first) (as permitted by Book 1, 4.5.1.2), at what distance and target arrangements will tie breaking shoot-offs be shot for entrance to the Elimination Rounds? Are they the same as expressed in Book 2, 7.6.5.2.1 for the 30 meter distance except that they would be shot at the last distance (e.g. 90 meter or 70 meter)?*

Response:

Yes, in that case the shoot-off would take place at 90 meters or 70 meters.

##### *Question 3:*

*There is no specification of how a shoot-off is to be conducted when it is breaking a tie for teams or individuals to enter the Elimination Round. The specifications for shoot-offs (e.g. one arrow per athlete, etc.) occur under the sections on breaking match play ties (Book 2, 7.6.5.2.2 Individuals (Match play); and 7.6.5.2.3 Teams (Match play)). Is the same format as specified for Match play to be used also for other shoot-offs? (Same question for Indoors, Book 3, 8.6.5.2.1 and 8.6.5.2.2).*

Response:

The shoot-off procedure is the same as for individuals in Match play. For teams, all three team members would shoot at the same time and the time limit is 40 seconds.

*Question 4:*

*What are the tie-breaking target arrangements and procedures for deciding medal placements when a tournament does not have Match play to decide the medals (e.g. only the Outdoor Target Round or the FITA 70 meter Round is used to decide medals)? Are they the same as expressed in Book 2, 7.6.5.2.1, 7.6.5.2.2, and 7.6.5.2.3?*

Response:

They would be as expressed in Book 2, 7.6.5.1.

In the case only the Indoor Target Round is used to decide medals, they would be as expressed in Book 3, 8.6.5.1

*A question was raised by a FITA Council Member as to whether or not string dampeners are permitted to be used on longbows.*

The Constitution & Rules Committee finds the question presented to be within terms of reference of the Technical Committee, and has determined that the following Interpretation of the Technical Committee is not contrary to the existing rules or Congress decisions.

**Response from the Technical Committee:**

Use of String Dampeners in the Long Bow Division:

It is the majority opinion of the Technical Committee that string dampeners are not legal in the Longbow Division. In one aspect or another, string dampeners contravene rules, Book 4, 9.3.2.3 and Book 5, 11.10.3.4.2 and 11.10.3.4.2.1 within the various disciplines where the Longbow division is allowed. It is clear that no attachments are allow on the bowstring in the Longbow Division other than two nocking points and string serving that may not end within the athletes vision.
