She is now the first woman to give her winning bow to the Olympic Museum in Lausanne, Switzerland. The ceremony took place at the beginning of the World Cup Final Press Conference on 25 September. ZHANG gave her bow to the Olympic Museum Director Mr. Francis GABET in front of numerous journalists and fans waiting for autographs. The sixteen archers participating at the upcoming World Cup Final were also present.

Medical & Sports Sciences

FITA Medical & Sports Sciences Committee Meeting

The FITA Medical & Sports Sciences Committee (MSSC) held its annual meeting in Lausanne, Switzerland, on 29 September 2008.

Acting Chairman Dr. Emin ERGEN (TUR), Members Dr. Carlos HERMES (GUA), Dr. Jean-Claude LAPOSTOLLE (FRA), Mrs. Nancy LITTKE (CAN) and Ex-Officio Staff Member Ms. Françoise DAGOURET worked on current activities and projects in the area of medical and sports sciences which include in particular:

- The distribution policy of the newly published Volume II of the Sport Medicine and Science in Archery book (see details below);
- ➤ The creation of specific web pages dedicated to Sport Medicine and Sciences in archery, with an easy and user-friendly access from the FITA website, where MSSC documents, references, recommendations could be found;
- The adaptation of the IOC Beijing Olympics Injury Prevention Study to the needs and specificity of archery;
- ➤ The question on whether physiotherapy service at FITA events can effectively respond to the needs of participant teams who do not have their own physiotherapist, and the purpose of such service. In the coming months Dr. Carlos HERMES will report on the COPARCO experience on this matter.













The MSSC is also involved in anti-doping matters, and on that subject:

- > Has acknowledged the report on the FITA anti-doping programme and activities presented by Françoise Dagouret.
- Has reviewed the FITA Therapeutic Use Exemptions (TUEs) policy. Due to the increasing workload generated by the full integration of para-archery under the authority of FITA, the MSSC plans to cooperate with a disabled sports specialist, in addition to the current panel members designated by the FITA TUE service provider IDTM, to assist Dr. ERGEN in the review of the TUEs on behalf of FITA.
- Has acknowledged the progress report made by Emin ERGEN on the research project on the possible performance-enhancing effects of benzodiazepines in the sport of archery. This project involves cooperation between FITA, the WADA accredited-laboratory in Ankara, the Hacettepe University School of Sport Sciences and Technology, and the Turkish Archery Federation. In April 2008 a research fund application has been submitted to the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA). However, the outcome of this application is unknown yet.
- Has reviewed the criteria in order to define the number of anti-doping tests at the various FITA events.

Dr. Emin ERGEN will represent FITA at the IOC annual meeting of Olympic IFs Medical Committee Chairpersons to be held on 8 November 2008.

Sports Medicine and Science in Archery, Volume II

In August 2008, on the eve of the Beijing Olympics, the MSSC has published the second volume of its Sports Medicine and Sciences in Archery Book, including features on:

- scientific foundations of training
- muscular activation strategies in archery
- > mathematical models in archery
- > sun and heat exposure
- > sun protection in archery
- keeping archery a clean sport: the FITA anti-doping programme
- a psychological approach model: advanced autogenous training in archery
- the travelling archer: stay healthy on the move

World Anti-Doping Code and FITA Anti-Doping Rules

During its meeting on 9 August 2008 in Beijing (CHN), the FITA Council has adopted new antidoping rules (Book 1, Appendix 5 of FITA Constitution & Rules), which will come into effect as of 1 January 2009.

The World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) has officially confirmed that FITA has successfully incorporated all the mandatory articles of the 2009 World Anti-Doping Code (the "Code") into its anti-doping rules, and that these rules are in line with the Code.

The new anti-doping rules, as well as a summary of main changes towards the current rules, can be downloaded in the "Rules/Bylaws" and "Clean Sport/Anti-Doping Rules" sections of the FITA website. This section also includes the 2009 Prohibited List International Standard, which has just been published by WADA.

The 2009 World Anti-Doping Code and its International Standards can be downloaded in the "Clean Sport/WADA Information" section.

FITA is currently working on the practical implementation of the new rules and all relevant information and instructions will be circulated to FITA stakeholders within the next three months. In particular, WADA will update the online ADAMS system in order to reflect the new standards.

Constitution & Rules

FITA Congress 2009 - Ulsan (KOR)

With the next FITA Congress taking place on the eve of the World Championships in Ulsan (KOR) starting on 1 September 2009, the Motions and Proposals for changing the FITA Laws shall be submitted to the FITA Secretary General no later than the very beginning of 2009, as per the timeline stated in Article 1.6.12.1, Book 1 of FITA Constitution & Rules (C&R).

Within the coming weeks, the exact Congress dates will be announced, together with the statutory Congress preparations timelines. A specific Congress 2009 webpage will be prepared and then will be updated regularly with documents, information, forms and announcements all along the period leading up to the Congress.

It is reminded that Motions and Proposals for changing the Laws may be submitted to the Secretary General only by Member Associations, Continental Associations, the President and Council (Article 1.6.12, Book 1 of FITA C&R).

Events

World Cup Final 2008 in Lausanne

The fantastic World Cup 2008 season came to an end on Saturday 27 September crowning four new champions at the Final in Lausanne. The new winning faces are IM Dong-Hyun (KOR), Justyna MOSPINEK (POL), Dietmar TRILLUS (CAN) and Jamie VAN NATTA (USA).

The venue for this event was the Montbenon Esplanade in the Olympic capital, surrounded by beautiful gardens and with an unrestricted view of Lake Geneva and the mountains.

Aside from the World Cup competition matches, some exhibition and initiation sessions were organised. The women's Olympic Champion ZHANG Juan Juan (CHN) and the Paralympic bronze medallist Philippe HORNER (SUI) shot three arrows on two copies of the 200 Swiss francs banknote.

Later on, FITA showed an event she considers for official competition in the future: a mixed double match featuring the Olympic champion Viktor RUBAN (UKR) and the Swiss champion and Olympian Nathalie DIELEN versus the team Olympic gold medallist PARK Sung-Hyun (KOR) and Chris MARSH, who still shoots for Switzerland until he starts on his position of competition manager for London 2012.

Recurve Men

In the men's recurve category gold was for Korea. IM Dong-Hyun photo—the reigning world champion from last year and also two-time team Olympic champion (Athens 2004 and Beijing 2008)—beat Ukraine's Olympic champion Viktor RUBAN in the gold final. The young and talented Frenchman Romain GIROUILLE took the bronze medal at the expense of another Korean, PARK Kyung-Mo.



Recurve Women

The gold medal was won by Poland's Justyna MOSPINEK photo, who defeated the 2004 individual Olympic champion, two-time team Olympic champion (Athens 2004 and Beijing 2008), individual Olympic silver medallist (Beijing 2008) and several-time world champion, Korea's PARK Sung-Hyun, in the final. YUN Ok-Hee of Korea beat the Italian Natalia VALEEVA—2007 world champion— to take the bronze.













Compound Men

In the men's compound category, the gold medal was won by the reigning world champion Canada's Dietmar TRILLUS photo, who beat the local archer Patrizio HOFER in the final. Patrick COGHLAN of Australia won the bronze. Italy again missed out on a medal with Italy's Sergio PAGNI taking fourth place.





Compound Women

Jamie VAN NATTA (USA) photo was the sole archer competing in the World Cup Final for the third time in a row. After a fourth place in 2006 and a bronze medal last year, she won gold in the women's compound event. The American beat Great Britain's Nichola SIMPSON in the final. Amandine BOUILLOT of France won the bronze medal, with Croatia's Ivana BUDEN leaving Lausanne empty handed.

The Stoke Mandeville European Archery Disabled Event has been held for the last four years. It is the National Championships of the British Wheelchair Archery Association which, for the past four years, has been opened up to include entries from other countries. In 2008, the tournament included teams from Canada, China, Cyprus, Finland, Norway, Poland, Spain, Sweden, Turkey, Ukraine and USA.

Para-Archery World Championships 2009

The Para-Archery World Championships in Nymburk, Czech Republic, will have the same format as the other FITA championships, namely a FITA Round followed by an Olympic Round.

Team events will be held for Compound and Recurve, Men and Women. In the recurve team event, the W2 and Standing classes are both included in the team.
