



FITA Congress

Decisions

The 48th FITA Congress took place in Ulsan, Korea on 30-31 August 2009 on the eve of the World Archery Championships. Congress delegates accepted with a strong majority some important changes, including the introduction of the mixed team event, a new format of competitions with set plays and the hit-miss scoring for compound!

A list of approved changes will be listed on the website early September that will show all accepted motions.

The world of archery took again some major steps forward at the occasion of the 48th FITA Congress. As of 1 April 2010, the mixed team competitions that were introduced as exhibitions in 2009 will be official! The mixed team event consists of one man and one woman from the same team shooting four ends of four arrows in a match.

As of 1 April 2010, archers will have to win three sets to win their matches. Each end of three arrows will count as a set. Of course, tie-breaks, as they occur, may still be required!

Congress also sent a clear message to give more identity to compound and differentiate their competitions. Compound means, ultimate accuracy and athletes will be able to prove it with the hit-miss scoring system. Compound archers will shoot at 50 metres with a very challenging hit zone target! The new set system, that was voted in will also apply. In order to give teams and archers time to adapt, to the hit-miss system, there will be first introduced at the medal finals at the World Cup stages next year but will only be made official (for World Championships, major games, etc.) as of 1 April 2011.

World archery has also given more time for young archers to develop. Cadets will now be able to shoot in their category through the year of their 17th birthday and juniors through the year of their 20th birthday. This will help the transition to true elite level. For practical reasons, this new rule will be applied as of 1 January 2010.

FITA had the pleasure to confirm eight new Member Associations: Algeria, Afghanistan, Benin, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Cameroon, Guinea, Montenegro and Tunisia.

Last but not least, the new World Archery logo has been officially presented in style to Congress!

Elections

Prof Dr Ugur ERDENER was brilliantly re-elected as FITA President during the second day of the 48th FITA Congress in Ulsan, Korea. A very appreciative Prof Dr ERDENER proposed to re-appoint Mr Tom DIELEN as Secretary General, who was warmly applauded by the congress delegates.

IOC Member Prof Dr ERDENER (TUR) and Tom DIELEN (BEL) will carry their second 4-year mandate with one goal in mind: continue the successful World Archery Plan.

Philippe BOUCLET (FRA) and Sanguan KOSAVINTA (THA) were also re-elected as FITA Vice-Presidents. Vladimir ESHEEV (RUS), Mario SCARZELLA (ITA) and Trudy MEDWED (AUT) will continue their mission in the Council and Kotaro HATA (JPN) will join them.

Congress also ratified the agreement between FITA and the International Paralympic Committee for the governance of para-archery and therefore, a new Para-Archery Committee was created with the following persons elected: Marco CARPIGNANO (ITA), Rita VAN DRIEL (NED), Carole HICKS (NZL) and Hans-Peter WERLEN (SUI).

The chairwoman of the former transition committee, Ann WEBB (GBR) was appointed as Honorary Chairwoman of the Committee—a well deserved recognition for her many years involvement in para-archery.

- Launch in 2009 the World Archery brand (the flagship product of archery) and have FITA as the producer
- A greater identity plan (differentiation) for Recurve and Compound for a better future for both

Olympic Solidarity Programmes 2009-2012

FITA has made a guide describing the Olympic Solidarity Programmes for 2009-2012. This guide should help the Member Associations in identifying which programmes could ease the archery development in their country, and how to apply to the selected programmes. Those who wish a copy of this guide should contact the FITA Office.

When such a programme is granted to a country, a significant funding is allocated. Among the available programme are some for the training of the archers, the education of the coaches and the development of the archery structure in a nation. Special Project

The International Foundation for the Development of Archery (FIDTA), with the financial assistance of Justice for Athletes, has released a programme to well prepare the archery event of the 2013 Mediterranean Games in Greece.

The main goal is to get a maximum of countries attending the archery event of these Games, but with a decent competition level. Therefore, to adequately assist the Mediterranean countries, different levels of assistance will be brought according to their level and economical status. In short, two groups of countries have received a proposal of assistance:

- 1st Group made of Algeria, Morocco, Malta, Montenegro, San Marino, Serbia, Syria and Tunisia. For these countries one male and one female archer have been proposed to attend a training camp at the FITA MEAC in Cairo (with free travel, accommodation and coaching) and some archery equipment depending on case by case basis
- 2nd Group made of Cyprus, Egypt, Lebanon, Libya and Monaco. For them one male and one female archer have been proposed to attend a training camp at the FITA MEAC in Cairo with free travel, accommodation and coaching.

The training camp for all these countries is scheduled from 29 November to 13 December 2009 at the FITA MEAC in Cairo (Egypt). All these countries have received the complete programme and the application process. We remind them that they should urgently submit their applications to the FITA Development Department, Mrs Deqa NIAMKEY at dniamkey@archery.org.

Training Camp for Member Associations of the Commonwealth

A training camp will be organised at the FITA MEAC for the Commonwealth Member Associations following the requests from several national federations. The camp will be for adult archers as a previous camp was organised this year for the youth. The camp will take place from 15-25 November 2009 under the expertise of coach MUN Baek Woon and will be coordinated by FITA Development Department.

This programme will be funded by the International Foundation for the Development of Archery (FIDTA) and various development partners. A complete document will be sent to the Member Associations of the Commonwealth, since there are specific conditions to respect. Each application will be evaluated by FIDTA for approval/disapproval.

International Archery Tournament in Benin

From 6-9 August 2009 an international archery tournament took place in Cotonou (BEN) at the "Stade de l'Amitié" with the participation of six neighbour countries.

Thanks to the support of the FIDTA (International Foundation for the Development of Archery), the Olympic Solidarity and the local authorities this event was a great success for archery in that part of the world, especially for the promotion of our sport.



The Stadium was invigorated by spectators, and the archers were delighted. Six African nations took part in this competition called the International Archery Tournament for West and Central Africa (TIZOCATA): Benin, Cameroon, Ivory Coast, Guinea, Senegal and Togo. Bamboo bows, standard bows and recurve bows were the three types of bows used for this competition. The archers from Benin skimmed through the competition with the bamboo bows and the archers from Ivory Coast won the recurve bow competition. Ivory Coast and Benin disputed the places for the recurve bow and a team competition was also organised.

At the occasion of this event, on 5 August a seminar was hosted for judges which continued throughout the entire period with practical sessions during the tournament. Moreover, on 27 July a seminar in the national language was held for sports journalists and presenters in order to teach them the archery terminologies. After the seminar a practice session was organised in order for them to gain practical experience.

A technical course for coaches took place after the tournament from 10-19 August conducted by Mr André KORLAAR (NED), who was assisted by Mr Paul ZINSOU (BEN), FITA Development Agent for West Africa and President of the Benin Archery Federation. The participants learned how to make strings, arrows and they learned the basic archery techniques for the bamboo bows and recurve bows.

FITA Accredited Training Centre

The FITA Accredited Partnership Training Centre in Bangkok (THA) was inaugurated in February 2006 and has been conducting many activities for the development of archery in that part of the world.

A training camp took place in July and August 2009 with the participation of neighbour countries such as Laos, Vietnam, Singapore, as well as the exceptional presence of Egypt. The participants trained with the Thailand National Archery team under the supervision of Coach KIM Sun Bin (KOR). Training was composed of practical and theoretical lessons at the Huamark Archery Field. The participants enjoyed this experience, and hopefully it will have a positive impact on archery in their countries.



The Bangkok Archery Training Centre is looking forward to renewing this experience with other countries wishing to benefit from their services and contribute to the development of archery.

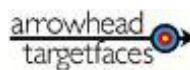
