Antalya 2014

Recurve division

Millimetres won gold medal shoot-off for China's recurve women at Antalya World Cup stage three that took place between 10 and 15 June. When China shot a seven with its last arrow of the shoot-off to drop from certain victory to a draw, Korea celebrated - but it was premature...

Korean men shot 57-point set average and took Antalya gold. No quarter for the Russian recurve men at Antalya: OH Jin Hyek, KIM Woojin and KU Bonchan bowled to a six-nil set point win, and another team gold medal. "I am happy to be back and part of a medal winning team," said KIM, the 2011 World Champion and 2012 World Cup Final Champion who was controversially left out of the last Korean Olympic team.

Tricky wind conditions and a fatal fourth set dip relegated India to silver in the Antalya recurve mixed team event. Gold for China. Korea's KIM Woojin and LEE Tuk Young beat Japan to recurve mixed team bronze. It was the second loss of the day for Ren HAYAKAWA – the women's team bronze was the first.

Florian KAHLLUND's spare bow netted him an individual stage title. When the young German's arrow rest broke on the last end of matchplay, he turned to his second for a shoot-off to decide Antalya gold. For both KAHLLUND and KU Bonchan, it was a first stage final.

Another Korean, CHANG Hye Jin, won the recurve women's final in convincing fashion. She started with a perfect 30 and did not lose a set to the 2011 World Cup Final winner CHENG Ming, from China.



Japan's Takaharu FURUKAWA and Ren HAYAKAWA won the recurve men's and women's bronze medals respectively.

Compound division


The Dutch took deserved revenge after losing the Medellin compound men's team gold medal match to the United States at stage two just weeks before. An extra four points on the Dutch total match score compared to Medellin made the difference.

Russia snapped USA compound women's run on World Cup team golds in 2014. The USA ladies fell behind in the third end and could not recover... bringing their medal haul in 2014 to three: two golds and one silver.



Belgium compound pair beat Colombia to Antalya 2014 mixed team title. Seeded just fifteenth, the Belgian double rampaged through the eliminations – beating world champion Italy – before winning gold on the Antalya beach.

CHOI Yong Hee won Korea its first compound men's gold on World Cup tour. In only the second year of the nation's participation in the World Cup compound events, CHOI beat Rajan CHAUHAN to Antalya gold. Just making the gold medal match was enough for CHOI: "the medal is just a bonus!"

Para Archery

Nove Mesto 2014

Nove Mesto's annual para archery world ranking event had three registrations for the new women's W1 competition class. Representing Great Britain and Italy, the women's W1 entrants were one short of the required four for a separate competition. Instead, the trio combined with the men to shoot in a universal W1 division. All three women qualified strongly, but were narrowly beaten in the first eliminations round.



Beijing 2008 Paralympic Champion David DRAHONINSKY (CZE) clinched W1 gold with a shoot-off win over Great Britain's John CAVANAGH in the final. This came after a pair of new world records during the qualification and elimination stages.

Two major continental tournaments remain on the para calendar in 2014. European titles will be redistributed in Nottwil, Switzerland from 26 July to 3 August, while there are already over 130 archery entries for the Incheon 2014 Asian Para Games multisport event in October.

Both Incheon and Nottwil are national team tournaments, but the first open entry Indoor Archery Para World Cup is scheduled for later this year. Held in conjunction with the second stage of the Indoor World Cup from 6-9 December, para athletes are encouraged to register for the Bangkok event early.



INTERPRETATIONS

WORLD ARCHERY CONSTITUTION AND RULES

Book 4, Article 22.3.8.1

The Finnish Archery Federation has requested has requested an interpretation on whether a finger tab on which markings (uniform in size shape and color) have been added by the athlete is permitted in the barebow division. See below for pictures of the tabs.

The Constitution and Rules Committee ("C&R") finds the question presented to be within the terms of reference of the Technical Committee after consultation with the Field and 3D Archery Committee.

C&R has determined that the following interpretation is not contrary to the existing rules or Congress decisions.

Response from the Technical Committee:

It is the majority decision of the Technical Committee that the use of tape or other such temporarily applied material for producing marks or lines on a tab is not legal in the barebow division.

In this particular case, the use of tape on each of the tabs in the attached photos represents memoranda. Since the tape it is not a permanent part of the tab, but simply a strip of adhesive, it is not physically part of the tab construction. The tape as used in the sample tabs is similar to bow sight tape which is placed on the bows sight bar where athletes mark in the distance.

Archery Austria has submitted the following interpretation requests:

Question 1:

In the Recurve and Compound division of field and 3D archery, must the 3 arrows in each (separate) end in Field or 2 arrows in each (separate) end in 3D be identical throughout the competition or can they be changed each end?

Question 2:

In the Barebow and Instinctive division of field and 3D archery, must identical arrows be used by athletes throughout the competition or can an athlete change the arrows each end during the competition (e.g., use different arrows for short and long distances)?

The Constitution and Rules Committee ("C&R") finds the question presented to be within the terms of reference of the Field Archery Committee.

C&R has determined that the following interpretation is not contrary to the existing rules or Congress decisions.

Response from the Technical Committee:

Question 1:

In the Recurve and Compound division of field and 3D archery, must the 3 arrows in each (separate) end in Field or 2 arrows in each (separate) end in 3D be identical throughout the competition or can they be changed each end?

Arrows must be identical during each end but an athlete can change to a set of arrows which are different from those used in prior ends as long as the arrows used in any single end are identical.

Question 2:

In the Barebow and Instinctive division of field and 3D archery, must identical arrows be used by an athlete throughout the competition or can an athlete change the arrows during the competition (e.g., use different arrows for short and long distances)?

An athlete's arrows must be identical throughout the competition.
