Olympic Channel

Launch date

The IOC announced the launch date for its ground-breaking new media destination, the Olympic Channel, where fans can experience the power of sport and the Olympic Movement all year round. Starting Sunday 21 August, after the Closing Ceremony of the Olympic Games Rio 2016, the Olympic Channel platform will be available worldwide via a mobile app for Android and iOS devices and at olympicchannel.com.



World Archery was one of 27 international federations to reach a cooperation agreement with the Olympic Channel in June ahead of its launch announcement.

Bjorn Bengston's target face license was terminated on 30 June 2016. As a result, the use of target faces produced by Bjorn Bengston is not permitted at any World Archery event as of 31 July 2016. This includes world record status, world ranking status and world-level international competitions. Appeal cases

Kinga Kiss-Johnson and Natalie Wells, both from the USA, issued appeals against sport class status non-eligible decisions given by World Archery classifiers.

Both cases were heard by the IPC Board of Appeal of Classification. In neither case could the board identify a breach of procedures made by World Archery classifiers.

The status of not eligible for para archery competition was upheld for both athletes.

Events

Road to Rio 2016

The World Archery Executive Board has assessed the criteria established by the IOC Executive Board and confirms it is satisfied that the three Russian athletes Tuiana Dashidorzhieva, Ksenia Perova and Inna Stepanova are eligible to compete at the Rio 2016 Olympic Games.

World Archery can confirm that these three athletes are among those that have been tested extensively. None of the three has previously been sanctioned for doping.

Since the publication of the initial report on issues with Russian Federation athletes, archers from the Russian Federation have been targeted for additional doping tests, both in- and out-of-competition. No Russian archery athlete has received an adverse analytical finding.

This decision, along with supporting evidence, will be submitted to the IOC and archery's expert appointed by the Court for Arbitration in Sport to be approved.

Six athletes will be heading to Rio on Tripartite invitations given to smaller or developing nations to promote universality in sport. The IOC publishes a list of countries eligible to apply ahead of the selection procedures opening for each Olympics. NOCs apply across the sports and, at the end of the qualification period, the IOC invites nations to fill the places. Libya, Bhutan, Malawi, Bangladesh, Nepal and Myanmar have taken those up at Rio 2016.

The selection procedure for Brazil's Olympic archery team started in early-2016, with a number of selection tournaments. The official team was revealed ahead of the Games' final entry deadline on 17 July. Marcus D'Almeida, Daniel Rezende and Bernardo Oliveira make up the men's team and Sarah Nikitin, Ane Marcelle Dos Santos and Marina Canetta the women's trio. Michelle Acquesta and Marcelo Costa were named alternates.

Evangelia Psarra replaces the Ivory Coast competitor in the recurve women's competition at Rio 2016. The Ivorian National Olympic Committee withdrew its entry after the final deadline. The 42-year-old Greek archer will be the most experienced Olympic archer in Rio – and the only archery athlete appearing at their fifth Games. She previously competed at Sydney 2000, Athens 2004, Beijing 2008 and London 2012.

Bucharest 2016

Four soon-to-be Olympians competed at the European Youth Archery Championships in Bucharest from 18-23 July, among them Adriana Martin who won in recurve junior women. The Spaniard qualified third, two spots behind another Rio-bound junior archer in Yasemin Anagoz. The Turkish athlete will be one of the youngest three athletes at this summer's Games. She and teammate Mete Gazoz are both 17, while Ricardo Soto, from Chile, is 16. The other Rio-bound competitors in Bucharest were Great Britain's Patrick Huston and Boris Balaz, from Slovakia, who both competed in the recurve junior men's competition.

Dublin 2016

More than 300 athletes from 30 countries are expected to attend the Dublin 2016 World Archery Field Championships running from 26 September to 2 October in Ireland. Tickets to the finals on 1/2 October are now on sale. The event is the main qualifier for the field archery competition at the 2017 World Games in Wroclaw, Poland. All categories will be given medals in Dublin as all received the minimum number of preliminary entries to be considered a World Archery Championships.

Odense 2016

Denmark, who had one qualifier for the Hyundai Archery World Cup Final outright in Sarah Sonnichsen, recently announced the six athletes who would fill the host nation spots at the 2016 Hyundai Archery World Cup Final in Odense. Erika Anear, Martin Damsbo, Maja Jager and Johan Weiss were the highest-ranked Danes not qualified. Hansen, the reigning World Archery Champion since winning the title on home soil in Copenhagen in 2015, shoots in the mixed team event for the second year in a row to defend gold.

Indoor World Cup 2016/17

Stages one and two of the 2016 Indoor Archery World Cup in Marrakesh and Bangkok are open for entry. Unlike the outdoor tour, the Indoor Archery World Cup is open entry. Any archer who is a member of a World Archery member association (national archery federation) may register directly to and compete in any of the tournaments.

For the fourth year running, the indoor season kicks off in the Moroccan imperial city of Marrakesh. Stage one runs 25-27 November 2016 and features a showcase of traditional local traditions, and hospitality, alongside the archery tournament.

The Asian and second stage of the circuit – in Bangkok, Thailand – takes place on 9-11 December 2016. Over the two days that follow the main Indoor Archery World Cup competition in 2016, Bangkok will also host indoor para, indoor youth, indoor masters and indoor barebow tournaments.

World record

USA compound man Braden Gellenthien scored 718 out of a possible 720 on the 72-arrow 50-metre round at the USA national outdoor championships, setting a new qualifying world best. He beats by one point the previous world-best mark shot by Mike "Mister Perfect" Schloesser at the opening stage of the 2016 Hyundai Archery World Cup in Shanghai, China. Braden said the score felt like a "rebirth of sorts" and that he was "excited for what the future holds".

BYLAW

Approved by World Archery Executive Board on 12 December 2015 Effective as of 1 April 2016

Book 3; Ch. 14; Art. 14.4, 14.4.1, 14.4.3 Book 4; Ch. 27; Art. 27.4,, 27.4.1, 27.4.3

- No changes to the procedure for manual scorecards.
- When one electronic scorecard and one manual scorecard is used the following will apply
- o In case of differences in arrow value(s), clearly the paper scorecard has the precedence. In case no arrow value has been entered on paper then no points will be given.
- o For what concerns the total score and 10s and Xs, the electronic total score,10s and Xs will be used based on the following conditions:
 - ✓ A score has been entered on the manual scorecard so verification is possible
 - √ The scorecard has been signed.
 - ✓ In case no 10s and Xs are entered on the manual scorecard no 10s and X's are registered for the athlete since no verification can be done.
 - ✓ In case no total score is entered on the manual scorecard when it is submitted to the results team, then the athlete should be disqualified (individual/team and mixed team where applicable)
