## Tokyo 2020

### Mixed team included

The International Olympic Committee has announced that archery will receive a fifth medal event at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games, with the recurve mixed team competition added to the existing programme of men's and women's individual and team events. The mixed team competition had been tested at the Youth Olympic Games and was officially introduced to the World Archery Championships in 2011.

## Broadcast Agreement

### NBC Sports Group

World Archery and NBC Sports Group have partnered on a four-year media rights agreement, giving the network the exclusive rights to televise and stream the federation's international archery events to audiences in the United States. The agreement runs from 2017 through to the end of the 2020, covering four Hyundai Archery World Cup seasons, and World Archery Championships in Mexico City in 2017 and the Netherlands in 2019.

### World #1

Colombia's Sara Lopez was pushed out of the top spot in the world ranking list by Sarah Sonnichsen, from Denmark, when it was published on 26 June 2017 with the inclusion of points accrued at stage three of the 2017 Hyundai Archery World Cup in Salt Lake City. Lopez spent a total of 1033 consecutive days ranked number one in the world, which is a record, counting lists issued since the Hyundai Archery World Cup was launched in 2006.

### World records

On 17 June 2017, reigning European and World Champion and multiple world record holder for the visual impaired category Steve Prowse beat his own world record for 72 arrows at 30 metres by 35 points. At the British National Championships in Aylesbury, he set the world best mark at 671, improving his 636 points from August 2015.

### Antalya 2017

Stage two of the season's international circuit saw Sara Lopez' incredible winning streak stopped at 31 matches. She was beaten by Tanja Jensen, who was then defeated by teammate Sarah Sonnichsen in the compound women's final. Sonnichsen left Antalya with three gold medals, in the individual, mixed team and team events. Individual titles also went to Chen Hsiang-Hsuan, Ksenia Perova and JC Valladont.

### Salt Lake City 2017

Olympic Champion Chang Hye Jin came within three points of breaking the world record, and beat all the men in the process, during qualifying at stage three. She then took recurve women's gold, while Im Dong Hyun the men's in a shoot-off. Mike Schloesser (world #2) beat Stephan Hansen (world #1) in a tiebreaker and Andrea Marcos took the second stage title of her career.

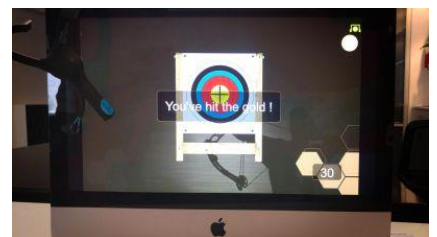

## Coaching

### Myanmar

Following an historical performance at the last Olympics, Myanmar's archery federation is capitalising on a surge in interest in the sport with a coach education programme designed to increase the availability of competent sports trainers across the country. Mid-May in Nay Pai Taw, World Archery certified coach trainer Tim Swane held a level 2 coaching course funded by Olympic Solidarity with 27 participants.

### Iceland

The member association of Iceland was very successful at the Games of the Small Nations held late May 2017 in San Marino. In conjunction with a recent Olympic Solidarity level 1 coaching course conducted by World Archery Development and Education Director Colmaire in Reykjavik on 7-14 June 2017, a new step forward was taken to put in place a national coaching programme.

The course was held in the private Archery Centre Bogfimisetrið, a large indoor space operated as a bowling lane with an archery shop inside, and open for training to any archer (registration fee required). The course was well organised and coordinated by Mr Indridi Gretarsson, who is also the Chairperson of the Coaching Committee of the Icelandic Archery Committee. Four members of the national squad also took benefit from an individual training from Pascal.



Pascal met with Mrs Halla and Mrs Ragnhildur from the National Olympic Committee, as well as the volunteers of the Icelandic Archery Committee to mainly discuss its status (the Committee currently being part of the NOC), that should evolve towards a national federation. Also, the current development and barriers of archery in Iceland were mentioned – despite great progress, there is still a lack of specific ranges (particularly outdoor), the classification of the archery equipment as a weapon remains a main issue, and archery business versus associative archery.

A national coaching programme project and development strategy should emerge from these meetings and discussions, with a bright future for archery in Iceland on target.

### Olympic Solidarity scholarship

The National Olympic Committee of Guinea benefitted from an Olympic Solidarity scholarship in favour of their archery coach Saa François Hamza Komano to attend the spring session organised by the Sports Academy Lausanne from 24 April to 16 June 2017. Hamza received generic and specific sport education, particularly for his thesis whose subject was the development of quantitative and qualitative archery in Guinea.



This is a project that mainly consists in the opening of a National Archery Centre. The operation of this centre would be focused on youth and training of the future physical education teachers. Congratulations to Hamza for his valuable project and graduation with the degree from CISEL (Cycle International du Sport Etudes Lausanne, Suisse)!

### Solomon Islands

To assist archery in the Solomon Islands, the Olympic Solidarity in association with World Archery have facilitated a level 1 coaching course in Honiara from 19 to 25 June 2017. This course benefited from a large media coverage that should facilitate the revival of archery in the Solomon Islands. All these elements of restarting the sport, training and reaching the objectives, strong media coverage fill World Archery satisfaction.



Nihal Seneviratne, President of Solomon Islands Archery, also was very happy with the output: "It's a great relief after going through one week of tutorial sessions and ending with a very competitive competition. Our archers have met the objective that was to equip them with important knowledge and understanding on how to play the sport. Thanks to Mohammed Ziaul Hoque from Bangladesh for accepting the offer to come and train our archers with different cultural background."

## Development

### Membership

The Solomon Islands submitted their membership application conformed to World Archery Rule 1.4.2. According to Rule 1.4.3, the current World Archery member associations and members of the Executive Board have 60 days for raising in writing to the World Archery office any objections to this affiliation request.

Without any serious objection within these 60 days (from 1 July 2017 to 31 August 2017), a temporary membership will be granted to the Archery Federation Solomon Islands until the next Congress scheduled on 13-14 October 2017 in Mexico City where the final membership of this national archery association will be submitted to a vote.
