Arrows for Hope



World Archery President Prof Dr Ugur Erdener presented a cheque for USD\$57,000 to Mexico City Director of Sport Horacio de la Vega at the close of the 2017 Hyundai World Archery Championships as a small contribution from the archery community towards the rebuilding of stricken areas of the city after the recent earthquakes.

The Arrows for Hope donation included contributions from World Archery, Hoyt, Easton, Global Sports Development, Longines, Hyundai, FILA, FFTA, Danage, Win&Win, DSB, FITARco and Krueger.

World Archery President Prof Dr Ugur Erdener said: "It is our hope that the inspiration gained by those who attended [the event] and our small donation towards the rebuilding of a city that welcomed us so openly, so soon after dealing with disaster, marks these world championships as an example of the positive impact that international sport can have."

Congress 2017

Elections

The 52nd Archery Congress in Mexico City started on Friday 13 October 2017 with voting delegates or appointed proxies representing 83 countries.

Prof Dr Ugur Erdener was unanimously re-elected unopposed as World Archery President for a fourth four-year term at the federation's 2017 Congress in Mexico City as delegates appointed officers to the Executive Board and committees.



"Thank you for your ongoing support," said Prof Dr Erdener as he addressed delegates, later adding: "It is a pleasure and an honour to continue as President of World Archery, one of the most forward-thinking, proactive and unified families in the world of international sport."

Through a video message, Thomas Bach congratulated Prof Dr Erdener for his great vision, dedication and leadership.

"More people than ever before can enjoy the fascination of your wonderful sport," he said. "You have every reason to look at the future with confidence."

"In this spirit of partnership and solidarity, I wish you all fruitful discussions and a successful Congress," the IOC President ended his video message.

Colombia's Maria Emma Gaviria and Sanguan Kosavinta of Thailand were re-elected Vice Presidents, and Greg Easton of USA, Vladimir Esheev of Russia, and Aladin Gabr of Egypt were re-appointed as members of the Executive Board.

Other members were elected to World Archery Committees, while Dr Emin Ergen was named Honorary Chair of the Medical and Sports Sciences Committee for his years of exemplary service as chairman of the World Archery permanent committee.

Motions and Members

All interpretations and bylaws approved by the Executive Board in the two-year period prior to Congress 2017 were confirmed by delegates. The first day was also marked by the voting on rule changes and the acceptance of new members.

Delegates accepted federations from Andorra, British Virgin Islands, Congo DRC, Djibouti, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Sierra Leone and Turkmenistan as full members. Solomon Islands and Togo, previously members, were also re-affiliated.

Nicaragua, Palau and Bosnia-Herzegovina were excluded by Congress for non-activity or non-payment of fees. The exclusions follow World Archery's principle of only maintaining active members, as confirmed at Congress in 2015 in Copenhagen.

Executive Board

Pre-Congress Meeting

World Archery's Executive Board passed five bylaws, including the continued ban of alcohol in competition, at its meeting prior to World Archery Congress on 12 October 2017 in Mexico City. The board tasked World Archery's Constitution and Rules and Medical and Sports Science Committees with finalising the required rules, which would then be approved by postal vote.

Executive Committee

Decision in relation to a protest from the Hungarian Archery Federation – World Archery 3D Championships 2017 – Gold Medal Match Instinctive Bow

"The Executive Committee has taken note of the protest of the Hungarian Federation in relation to a switch of scores on target 1 of the gold medal match between Christensen and Molnar by the Target Judge. The Executive Committee has decided unanimously that the protest cannot be upheld since it is simply too late and that the result stands for what concerns the World Championships title. It is however clear from an analysis of the video images in HD that the target judge in question made a mistake. Since it is impossible to predict what the outcome of the match would have been if the scores would have been written down correctly, a second gold medal will be awarded to Molnar. The result however will not be modified as such since no protest was made within the timelines foreseen in the rules. The World Archery Judge Committee has been asked to look into the matter in terms of consequences for the judge concerned."

Good Governance

Targeting Gold

World Archery has released "Targeting Gold", a guide to developing a successful strategy. The document, available in English, Arabic and Spanish, was prepared by Pascal Colmaire, the Strategic Planning and Good Governance Working Group and TSE Consulting.

It is a tool for member associations to analyse and assess their governance strategies, and based on the answers to the recent good governance strategy approximately 35% of the membership has no plan in place. World Archery's goal is 100% implementation by 2020.

Workshops related to good governance were held at Congress.



"Targeting Gold – The Archery Workbook to developing a successful strategy" is already available in English, Arab, and Spanish. The French version is being finalised, and the Russian version will follow.

The guide will be sent to each member association and soon uploaded on the World Archery extranet and website.

Mexico City 2017

Sebastien Peineau upset defending champion Stephan Hansen in the compound men's gold medal match – and Olympic Champion Chang Hye Jin was felled by gritty Ksenia Perova for the recurve women's title.

Im Dong Hyun and Wei Chun Heng went down to an incredible shoot-off – both shooting reds – in the recurve men's event, and Song Yun Soo cruised to victory in the compound women's to become the second consecutive Korean women's winner.

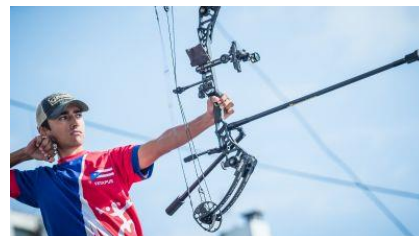
Registration deadline for team entries

Panama

The Asociación Nacional de Tiro con Arco de Panamá benefitted from Olympic Solidarity assistance through a 10-day Level 1 Coaching Course funded and organised on 4-14 October 2017 in Panama City for a dozen of participants, among them five women. The sport of archery being under construction in the country, only one participant had experience in the sport. The other participants were coaches or athletes from other sports.



The World Archery Certified Coach Trainer from Venezuela, Gary Alejandro Hernandez Bolivar, conducted the course according to the World Archery Level 1 Programme with some additional archery basics. The candidates were evaluated at the end of the course both in the classroom and on the range.

Even though Archery in Panama is not participating in competitive events, a favourable environment and abundant number of promising members can be observed.

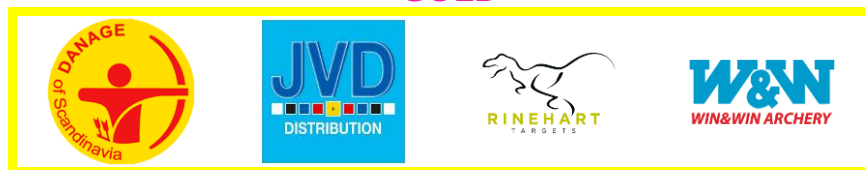

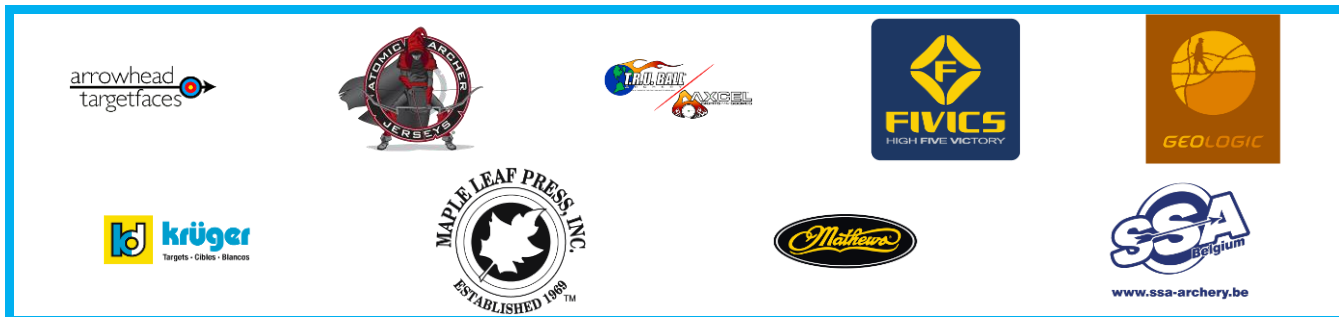
