Broadcasting

Broadcast time

The worldwide broadcast time of live, delayed and highlight footage of the Hyundai Archery World Cup circuit reached over 600 hours in 2018, including data from an independent study, close to doubling the amount across the previous season. Longtime partner Eurosport continued to provide exposure - as did NBC via the Olympic Channel linear and online platforms, and NBCSN. A new three-year deal with KBS, which came into effect mid-season, produced strong figures in Korea.

Excellence Centre

OS Scholarships

On 23 October, Marlyse Hourtou joined the group of three Olympic Solidarity scholarship archers already training at the World Archery Excellence Centre in Lausanne, Switzerland. The 22-year-old from Chad, the first female to join the programme, will also be coached by Kyeong Su. Sudan's Mahmoud Abdelwahab and Malawi's Areneo David have been at the Centre since 1 May 2018, and Ruman Shana MD from Bangladesh arrived on 18 June. The goal is to raise their level with a view towards qualification for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games.



Pre-world championships training camp

The World Archery Excellence Centre will host an international training camp from 27 May to end June 2019 with participants choosing their arrival and departure dates.

The objective is to assist national teams competing in the World Archery Championships in 's-Hertogenbosch, Netherlands. The training camp is planned for the period between the end of the Hyundai Archery World Cup stage in Antalya and the start of the world championships, allowing national teams to stay in Europe instead of potentially returning home between the two events.

Para Archery

Para Archery Seminar

Africa's first para archery seminar took place in the Egyptian capital of Cairo on 29 October to 10 November, with 25 participants from 11 nations across the continent in attendance. The seminar was split into two parts. The first week consisted of a level one training course conducted by World Archery's development agent in Africa, Khaled Lamandé, and Egyptian coach trainer Ahmed Hassan, and the second was focused specifically on coaching para archery.

Complete classification master list available online

An accurate master list of the approximately 900 individuals classified as eligible to compete in para archery events is now available on the World Archery website.

It contains the name, country, date of birth, classification detail and sport class, and the date and time of classification. The list is available for coaches, classifiers, judges and tournament organisers, who require the information to confirm eligibility. No other personal data is available.

For individuals with a provisional classification, the date of expiration has been added in red. These athletes must undergo a complete classification process before participating in a para archery event.

Despite the recent changes to W1 criteria, there is an increasing number of athletes classified to eligible and it is encouraging that member associations are investing in this area of the sport.

Athletes classified non-eligible for para archery may still seek to use an assistive device in ablebodied and open competition. These athletes will need to apply to a new World Archery panel; details to be announced soon.

World Archery Africa

World Archery Africa approved a system of staggered elections at an extraordinary congress held in Cairo, Egypt on 10 November. The change was made to prevent inactive council members from impeding the ability of the continental federation to function. Elections took place to implement the new system straight away.

World Archery Asia

The Bangladesh Archery Federation hosted a five-day international joint training camp on 5-9 November in the capital city of Dhaka, which attracted 44 athletes and coaches from 10 Asian countries. It is the first time such a camp has been held in Bangladesh, with previous such initiatives largely based in Chinese Taipei and Thailand. Training camps are integral to Asia's continental development programme.

Achievements

World record

The USA's Casey Kaufhold, 14, scored 589 out of a possible 600 points during the first qualification session at the GT Open, the first tournament on the 2018 Indoor Archery World Series calendar, to set a new recurve cadet women's world record. She beat the previous mark, set by Italy's Tatiana Andreoli in early 2016, by a point. At the end of the first day at the GT Open, Kaufhold's score led the recurve field.

Athlete of the month

Sixteen-year-old Trenton Cowles was named the United States Olympic Committee's male athlete of October 2018 for his goldmedal-winning performance at the Youth Olympic Games in Buenos Aires, Argentina. His gold is the USA's first archery medal at the Youth Olympic Games since the guadrennial event was launched in 2010.



Events

GT Open

World Archery's rebranded open-entry indoor circuit began on 23 November in Strassen, Luxembourg when the GT Open holds the first Indoor Archery World Series 250 competition with over 300 archery taking part. Sarah Prieels scored 595 out of a possible 600 points to match the 18-metre 60-arrow ranking round world record set in 2014 by Erika Jones and lead compound women's qualification. Braden Gellenthien, Casey Kaufhold, and Steve Wijler - who tied on points with Cedric Rieger – also took top seedings.

Fourteen-year-old Casey Kaufhold converted her cadet world record and top-seeded qualifying round into the recurve women's individual title on 25 November in Strassen. Kaufhold levelled her final with second seed Gabriela Bayardo in the fifth set, before delivering a 10 in the tiebreak to beat her opponent's nine and secure the victory.

Domagoj Buden won the compound men's competition, also in a shoot-off. He led Stephan Hansen by a point for most of the match but said, after recently changing to a back tension release aid, he found the pace of the alternate shooting in the final challenging. The world's number two-ranked recurve man, Steve Wijler, and Toja Ellison were the other two winners at the GT Open.

JVD Open

Wijler, Laurena Villard, Paul Steve Tedford and Sabine Sauter took individual titles at the 2018 Kings of Archery Series: JVD Open, held in Eindhoven, Netherlands on 17-18 November. Kings of Archery was founded in 2011 and expanded with the support of Netherlands-based archery distributor JVD in 2018. The tournament uses an unusual Vegas Shoot-style, 90-arrow qualification format. Unlike Vegas, recurve archers score the whole gold as 10.

Hyundai Indoor Challenge

The World Archery Excellence Centre in Lausanne welcomed 91 participants from Switzerland, France, Czech Republic, Slovakia and Italy for the first Hyundai Indoor Challenge on 27 October 2018. The Olympic Solidarity scholarship archers currently training at the Centre also participated, with Md Ruman Shana from Bangladesh finishing first in the recurve men's competition with 587 points.

Russian Youth Indoor Championships

A record number of 715 archers competed in Russia's national youth indoor championships, held on 20-25 November in Velikie Luki in the Pskovskaya region – a town situated around 500km west of Moscow. Russia's national events are split into three types: those open only to national squad members the country's approximately 32 regional teams; tournaments for clubs, regions and schools; and open-entry competitions. The event in Veliki Luki started 25 years ago as the 'Hopes of Russia' school championships but was recently opened up to clubs and regions.

Coaching

Level 1 courses in Africa and Asia

World Archery Africa and World Archery Asia will both host a level 1 course from 9-17 December, the first at the Idrid Mahamat Stadium in N'djamena, Chad, and the second in Lahore, Pakistan. Abdu Zakaria and the other experts appointed for the African course will have to adapt and arrive earlier in order to build the necessary equipment (bows, arrows). In Asia, the Bangladesh Archery Federation national coach, Mohammad Zia, has been appointed as an expert for the event.

Coach Trainer seminar

A World Archery level 1 Coach Trainer seminar was conducted by development director Pascal Colmaire and local expert Jorge Cabrera from 3-12 November 2018 in Mar del Plata, Argentina, with the support of Olympic Solidarity, World Archery Americas and World Archery Argentina. During the 10 days, nine candidates from Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Peru and Uruguay were trained and evaluated on transmitted archery basics using World Archery methodological and pedagogical criteria. Within a one-year period they are required to conduct a level 1 coaching course in their countries in order to complete their evaluation and be certified as World Archery coach trainers for four years.

Job vacancies in India

Indian sports foundation Olympic Gold Quest has advertised two new full-time coaching positions based in Pune. One role is to assist in preparing elite archers for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games and the other is a junior developmental position focused on training youth athletes aged between 11 and 16. The jobs are salaried and include accommodation provided by the employer. Olympic Gold Quest supports elite Indian athletes.
