Olympian Health Study

World Olympians Association has launched the largest ever global study that will analyse the long-term health issues of Olympians. The study is supported by the IOC Medical and Scientific Commission, the IOC Athletes' Commission and the IOC Athletes' Entourage Commission. Message from Para Archery Committee

One of the goals for the World Archery Para Archery Committee this year is to improve communication with national and continental para archers and sport organisations. In many countries, the para archers are represented by World Archery member associations and we can directly link with them and communicate news. However, many other para archers are represented by other sport federations or Paralympic organisations and we do not have contact with these organisations directly. This makes it very difficult to get information out to archers as well as learn more about the needs and activities of para archery and para archers in these organisations.

Therefore, we are asking member associations to link with any para sport federations or organisations in their countries or continental association to assist the Committee in improving our communication and providing support to all existing and/or potential para archers around the world. We need your help and are asking member associations to encourage para archery within their own membership. If a different organisation manages para sport in their country, our members should develop a close working relationship to assist the development of para archers and para archery coaches.

This includes all para archers, also VI archers. We are trying to develop and grow this classification of archers at both the national and international levels but are struggling getting information to help make short or long-term plans.

Finally, we are asking member associations to consider sending some physios/orthopaedic specialists to World Archery classifier training when they are advertised. We need more well trained National and International Classifiers to help us grow the sport.

World Record

Danelle Wentzel scored 357 out of a possible 360 points for 36 arrows at 60 metres to set a new world record at South Africa's national championships on 31 March. The score was one point more than the previous world best, set by Belgium's Gladys Willems in 2007.

Events

Shanghai 2018

Kim Woojin, Chang Hye Jin, Kim Jongho and Sara Lopez became the first athletes to book spots for the Hyundai Archery World Cup Final in Samsun at the circuit's first stage of the season in Shanghai, China on 28/29 April. A new rule introduced for 2018 sees victors at each of the four legs be awarded places rather than having to wait until the points are decided at the conclusion of the year.











Other highlights included Chang Hye Jin's incredible perfect set in the recurve women's final, when she shot three arrows within the X10 ring (a group measuring three centimetres across) at 70 metres; Lopez' victory putting her back to the top of the world rankings, and the emergence of China's An Qixuan shooting for gold at her first international event - and Vanessa Landi.

Barranquilla 2018

The remaining 18 quota places for the 2018 Central American and Caribbean Games - which are being held in Barranquilla, Colombia on 28 July to 3 August - were awarded at the final qualifier in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic on 8 April. Fourteen nations have qualified archery places to compete in Barranguilla.

Copa Merengue 2018

El Salvador's Roberto Hernandez beat Nelson Salinas of Argentina to the compound men's gold medal at the Copa Merengue world ranking event in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic on 8 April 2018 after scoring an international careerbest 714/720 points for his ranking round. His was El Salvador's lone podium finish of the tournament, with hosts Dominican Republic leading the table with 17 medals in total.

Asia Cup 2018

The Philippines' Paul Marton De La Cruz won compound men's gold at the second stage of the 2018 Asia Cup in his home city of Manila, shooting a 10 to beat Chinese Taipei's Chen Hsiang-Hsuan in a single-arrow shoot-off to decide the final. Paul Marton qualified top in Manila with 704 out of a possible 720 points for the 72-arrow 50-metre ranking round.
