### **Excellence Centre**

### New Staff

At the end of September 2018, Christine Jennings left the World Archery Excellence Centre to take up a position at the United States Olympic Committee. Christine was responsible for the archery activities organised in the Centre as well as coordinating some development projects for World Archery, including those supported by Olympic Solidarity like the resident athlete programme hosted at the World Archery Excellence Centre since the beginning of 2018.

Melanie Postigo has been hired to assume Christine's position within the same areas of responsibility. Melanie is a barebow archer, an archery instructor and a judge candidate in the French Archery Federation. She lived in Spain and recently in France, and has experience in sport management. Melanie speaks French, Spanish and English.

### Training Camp and Coaches Seminar

Korean archery expert Kim Hyung Tak returned to the World Archery Excellence Centre in September 2018, following a successful visit in 2017. He recorded training camp participants using his video analysis method. On 15-16 September, Coach Kim concluded his stay in Lausanne by giving a two-day coaching seminar, during which he divulged some of the vast knowledge and experience he has gained working with archers from all over the world.

### Para Archery Adaptive Course

A para archery adaptive coaching seminar was held in the World Archery Excellence Centre on 21-23 September. The course was supported by the International Paralympic Committee, the AGITOS foundation and World Archery. The objective was to increase the knowledge of para archery coaching, creating an opportunity for existing coaches to improve their understanding of working with impaired athletes by learning from world-class experts.

The course was delivered by MJ Rogers, a USA Archery assistant coach for the Rio 2016 and London 2012 Olympic Games, who also coached a Canadian archer at the Athens 2004 Olympic Games. Rogers headed up the writing of the Adaptive Archery Educational Manual in the USA and is also the current coach of notable US para archers Matt Stutzman and Eric Bennett.

### **IPC Anti-Doping Committee**

Great Britain's Pippa Britton has been appointed as a member of the International Paralympic Committee's anti-doping committee following a meeting of the organisation's governing board in Madrid, Spain in mid-September. Pippa will serve on the committee until a governance review has addressed the organisation's committee structure.

### Para World Ranking Event

From 7 to 9 September, USA Archery hosted 50 para-athletes representing Brazil, Canada, Puerto Rico, Singapore and USA at the Easton Salt Lake Archery Center in Salt Lake City, Utah. The competition consisted of a single 72-arrow round, individual eliminations and team rounds in the compound men open, compound mixed and recurve mixed categories.

Classification was held over two days preceding the competition and reviewed 15 athletes. Visually Impaired (VI) classification was also held and four athletes were reviewed.

### World Ranking

The Netherland's Steve Wijler was named world number one for the first time in his career when the new ranking list was released on Monday 3 September 2018, one day after he took recurve men's gold at the 2018 European Archery Championships in Legnica, Poland. Wijler knocked Korea's Kim Woojin off the top spot.

## Past Events

### Vegas Shoot 2018

Canada's Chris Perkins has been named 2018 Vegas Shoot Champion following the disqualification of Bob Eyler for the violation of anti-doping rules. Perkins was the Lucky Dog in 2018 and finished second to Eyler in the shootdown. With Eyler's disqualification, Perkins was promoted from ninth place to first. As well as collecting the 52,000 USD grand prize, he becomes the second person in history to win The Vegas Shoot from the Lucky Dog position after Sergio Pagni in 2016.

### Events

### Indoor World Series

Registrations are now being accepted for all six events on the calendar of the 2018 Indoor Archery World Series. The circuit runs from November to February 2019 and features events in Luxembourg, China, Italy, Korea, France and the USA. Each of the tournaments is open entry, meaning archers register themselves rather than needing to be part of a national team. ### Open WAREOS

All registration for Indoor Archery World Series events is completed through Open WAREOS. The event rules specify that the tournaments are open entry, meaning athletes register themselves as long as they are a current member of a World Archery member association.

Athletes should be aware that member associations have seven days to confirm eligibility. If there is any doubt, refrain from booking air tickets for seven days - after which time, if no action has been taken, confirmation is automatic.

Member associations receive a notification each time an athlete registers and it is the responsibility of the federation to check whether that athlete is in good standing. Member associations have seven days to flag invalid registrations through Open WAREOS. This flag may be removed later if the athlete becomes in good standing. Registration will automatically be considered valid if no flag is raised within seven days.

Registered athletes will be added to the entry list following payment and confirmation from the tournament organiser.

### Samsun 2018

The 2018 Hyundai Archery World Cup Final took place in Samsun, Turkey on 29/30 September. Two new champions emerged by winning gold medal matches against surprise challengers from the host nation, with the USA's Kris Schaff beating Demir Elmaagacli to the compound men's title and Korea's first-year international Lee Eun Gyeong taking recurve women's gold ahead of Yasemin Anagoz.

Sara Lopez won her fourth title at the World Cup Final, drawing level with Brady Ellison for the most ever by a single athlete, and Kim Woojin took his third. A random draw was used to determine the brackets for the first time.

### Cortina 2018

The 2018 World Archery Field Championships took place in the beautiful mountainous landscapes surrounding Cortina d'Ampezzo in northern Italy. From the qualifications on ski slopes to the finals, set underneath the ski slope used at the 1956 Winter Olympic Games, the courses were as picturesque as they were challenging, both technically and physically.

The week finished with Germany winning both senior team titles; Swedish barebow couple Lina Bjorklund (3) and Erik Jonsson (5) adding to their world title tallies; Lisa Unruh defending her recurve women's crown, and Japan's Oonuki Wataru taking an unlikely men's victory.

Target archery's world number one, Mike Schloesser of the Netherlands, won gold in the compound men's event in his debut on the field course, while the USA's Paige Pearce took the compound women's win.

### Asian Championships 2019

World Archery Asia reallocated the host country of the 2019 Asian Archery Championships and Asian Para Archery Championships from New Delhi, India to Bangkok, Thailand at the organisation's extraordinary Executive Board meeting held in Jakarta, Indonesia on 27 August 2018. Both events will include continental qualification tournaments for Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games. Dates are still to be confirmed.

### Hyundai Archery World Cup 2019

World Archery has announced that Medellin, Colombia has replaced Salt Lake City, USA in the 2019 Hyundai Archery World Cup calendar, as the Americas stage of the international tour is moved to the start of the season. The 2019 stage is expected to be held in the last week of April, shortly before the traditional opening leg in Shanghai, China. European events in Antalya, Turkey and Berlin, Germany complete the four legs, with the venue and date for the 2019 Hyundai Archery World Cup Final yet to be announced.

### Tokyo 2020 Test Event

Tokyo 2020 have officially confirmed that the archery test event will be held from 11 to 18 July 2019 at Dream Island Archery Field with the following preliminary schedule:

- 11 July: Official Practice, equipment/uniform inspection and team managers meeting 12 July: Ranking Round
- - Mixed Team Eliminations and Finals 13 July: Individual Eliminations
- 14-16 July:
  - Women's Finals
- 17 July: 18 July: Men's Finals

## **Clean Sport**

### Sanction

Following the conclusion of the full investigation and arbitration procedure, the US Anti-Doping Agency and NFAA handed Bob Eyler a two-year period of ineligibility from 28 September 2018. This sanction is fully recognised by World Archery. Included in the announcement was a statement confirming that ignorance of the anti-doping rules is not regarded as a viable defence. If an athlete needs to take a prohibited substance for medical purposes, then that athlete must follow the proper procedure and obtain a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) prior to competition.
