Recognition

Athletes of the Year

The winners of the World Archery Athlete of the Year awards for 2018 were announced during the 2019 Indoor Archery World Series Finals in Las Vegas on 9 February. Sara Lopez won the compound women's trophy for the fourth year in a row.

Mete Gazoz and Yasemin Anagoz were named recurve man and woman of the year. Turkey also won the recurve women's award, courtesy Yasemin Anagoz, the para women's award thanks to Merve Nur Eroglu - while Goktug Ergin was named coach of the year.

World Archery has presented annual awards to recognise outstanding performance from athletes and coaches since 2014. Nearly 100,000 public votes were cast for the 2018 awards.

Congress

Call for nominations

Nominations are now open for positions available in the elections at World Archery Congress, the World Archery Para Championships and the World Archery Championships in Den Bosch, Netherlands in 2019. Forty-four official positions across World Archery's governance are up for election. Elections will take place during congress on 1-2 June. The deadline for nominations is 4 March.



Elections for athlete representatives will take place during the para and world championships. The deadline for nominations is 3 May for the para representative position and 10 May for recurve man, recurve woman, compound man and compound woman nominations.

Complete congress documentation will be distributed to member associations on 13 March, following the closure of the nomination period.

Secretary general Tom Dielen will host a conference call to answer questions regarding nominations, role requirements and the election process on 1 March at 13h00 GMT. Officials from member associations wishing to register for this meeting should contact sluik@archery.org.

Technology Services

Result system, timing and TV graphics

The World Archery IT department now offers the following services to member associations:

- Ianseo results system; web-based, works on all operating systems
- Live-scoring application; Ianseo integrated, compatible on Android devices (minimum requirements apply)
- Accreditation and access control application; Ianseo integrated, a system of registration and managing credentials across a venue
- Judge application; Ianseo integrated, helps judges manage event operations
- Timing system; Ianseo integrated, application-based timing software that outputs clock and results to televisions or LED panels, previously used on Indoor World Series
- Television graphics; Ianseo integrated, CasparCG-based broadcast-level graphics package licensed for member association use only

Since all software developed by World Archery and Ianseo is open source and free to download, only services that require human resource or development have a cost. Hardware is available to rent from World Archery or continental federations and specifications can be provided. Certain services require pre-event training to limit necessary on-site support. Customisation is also available.

Mexico

Salvador Olvera, President of the Mexican Archery Federation from 1988 to 1992, passed away in Mexico City on 1 February 2019.

Argentina

Luis Ferrari, compound archer and former president of the Argentinean Archery Federation passed away on 19 February 2019. Ferrari medalled at the Pan American Championships held in Mexico City in 1996 and in Havana in 1998. He was South American Champion in 1998, and represented Argentina at the World Championships in Victoria, Canada in 1997 and in Riom, France in 1999.

World Archery has lifted its suspension of the Polish Archery Federation, subject to the delivery of documentation related to recent elections, to ensure athletes' preparations for the upcoming World Archery Championships are not harmed. The action was approved by the Executive Board and effective as of 21 February 2019. The Polish federation had been suspended since 15 October 2018.

France

The French archery federation has launched a campaign to send second-hand archery equipment to developing countries in Africa. Called partage ton arc, transmets ta passion or 'share your bow, transmit your passion' in English, the project sees regional committees collect unused gear from clubs and members and send it to the federation headquarters. The federation then distributes it internationally, covering the logistical costs from source to destination.

Achievements

World record

Claudia Wohlleben scored 573 out of a possible 600 points for the 60-arrow 18-metre ranking round to set a new recurve masters women's world record on 20 January 2019 at the Bavarian championships in Augsburg, Germany. The score was one higher than the previous record of 572, set by Marie-Claire van Stevens on 2 December 2002 in Ottignies, Belgium. Wohlleben, 52, also increased the German national record by four points. She won a first national title in 2018.

Indoor World Series

Sim Yeji, Steve Wijler, Viktoria Balzhanova and Kris Schaff won the individual titles at the 2019 Indoor Archery World Series Finals, held on Saturday 10 February 2019 in the evening after the second day of The Vegas Shoot, fifth and final stage of the season's indoor circuit. The inaugural Indoor World Series inaugural included events in Luxembourg, China, Italy, France and USA, a total of five stages and the grand finale.

Vegas Shoot 2019

Sergio Pagni beat-out 23 other archers in the largest shootdown ever to take the compound open championship at the 53rd Vegas Shoot and win a first-prize cheque for USD 53,000. It is the second time the Italian archer has won the event in four years, having taken his first title at the 50th edition in 2016. Sara Lopez won the compound women's event ahead of fellow 900-point scorer So Chaewon, 29 to 28, in the first end of the first perfect shoot-off in the category.

Coaching

Coach trainer course in Morocco

Africa's second coach trainer course, and first in French, was held at the Centre de Formation des Cadres Moulay Rachid in Salé, near Rabat, Morocco, on 11-20 February 2019. Ten coaches from four countries - Algeria, Australia, Cameroon and Morocco - received training from World Archery development and education director Pascal Colmaire.



Level 1 course in Mauritius

The Mauritius Olympic Committee headquarters and Mauritian Football Federation facilities in the city of Quatre Bornes hosted a level one coaching course from 21 to 31 January 2019. Organised at the request of the Mauritian Archery Federation and led by World Archery development officer for Africa Khaled Lamandé, the training was attended by 20 participants from nine clubs across the islands of Mauritius and Rodrigues. Two attendees came from the hospitality industry, wishing to offer archery as an activity at their hotels, and the class included three women. Thanks to this training, the federation in Mauritius will reinforce its team of club coaches and teach archery with a common curriculum.



Development

Solidarity with North African countries

The French Archery Federation has offered Algeria, Morocco and Tunisia help in training their judges. For one year, the FFTA's national judge commission chair will assist the three federations in structuring programmes and a French teacher will visit each of the three countries to educate two judges, who will then train more people in their own countries. Trained judges will also be invited to participate in a judge conference in France in 2020.









Fiji

The nation of Fiji consists of a collection of volcanic islands in the South Pacific Ocean. It's a country known for its rugby and beautiful beaches but, over the past decade, archery has started to gain a foothold. A decade ago, Fiji had five active archers, now it has 50.

The training camp is planned for the period between the end of the Hyundai Archery World Cup stage in Antalya and the start of the world championships, allowing national teams to stay in Europe instead of potentially returning home between the two events.
