Athletes Committee

Elections

A new athletes committee is elected at each World Archery Championships and World Archery Para Championships immediately preceding the Olympic and Paralympic Games. The committee represents international competitors within World Archery's governance.

The athletes are nominated by member associations and then archers at the championships vote for their category's representative to the committee: one each recurve man, recurve woman, compound man, compound woman and para athlete.

Agreement

World Archery and the Court of Arbitration for Sport have agreed that future alleged anti-doping rule violations will be adjudicated, and any sanctions issued, by the organisation's new Anti-Doping Division. The international federation had previously appointed its own independent three-person panel. Responsibility for appointing that panel now falls to the new Anti-Doping Division.

Members

World Archery Europe

World Archery Europe has officially become a member of the European Paralympic Committee. The World Archery continental association was accepted unanimously by the delegates at the 13th EPC General Assembly in Netanya, Israel on 4 May 2019.



Lesotho

The Federation of Archery Lesotho was accepted as temporary members on 28 May 2019. A decision on their full membership will be taken at World Archery Congress on 1-2 June 2019. Applications from other potential members are still in the process of being acknowledged.

Niue

The Niue Archery Association has submitted a membership application as per World Archery rule 1.5.1. According to rule 1.5.2, current World Archery member associations and members of the executive board have 60 days to raise in writing to the World Archery office any objections to this affiliation request. Without any serious objection within 60 days (30 May 2019 to 28 July 2019), temporary membership will be granted to the Niue Archery Association until the next Congress in 2021 where the final membership of this national archery association will be submitted to a vote.

Rules

Interpretation

Alcohol has been considered a banned substance at any competition under World Archery rules since the start of 2018, when it was removed from the prohibited list by the World Anti-Doping Agency. A recent interpretation has clarified the extent to which alcohol is considered banned at any competition held under World Archery rules.

Indian sub-continent

Obituaries

Morten Wilmann

World Archery judge committee chair Morten Wilmann died on Wednesday 15 May 2019 aged 68 after a long battle with illness. Morten was deeply involved in archery's governance internationally and in Norway. He was an international judge for 27 years until 2016 and joined World Archery's judge committee in 1991, of which he became chair in 2007, as well as serving on the target committee from 1993 to 2001 (as chair 1997-2001).

Victoria Cook

The USA's Victoria Cook, World Archery Champion in 1963, died of a heart attack on 18 April 2019. Born in 1933, Vicky began shooting in June 1959 when her doctor recommended fresh air and sunshine after she contracted polio and underwent surgery the previous winter. Only three months after picking up a bow, she won her first Minnesota state championship and represented the USA at world championships in the 1960s and 1970s.

Achievements

World records

Korea's Lee Woo Seok and Choi Misun raised the recurve mixed team ranking round record by four points after scoring 688 and 680, respectively, over qualification at the second stage of the 2019 Hyundai Archery World Cup in Shanghai, China. "I hadn't realised we'd broken the world record. It's good to break it, I'm happy, but this is just the start of the competition. The eliminations are more important," said Misun.

Great Britain's compound women seeded fourth at the qualification of the third stage of the 2019 Hyundai Archery World Cup in Antalya, Turkey and broke the junior team ranking round world record for the second time this year. Layla Annison, Ella Gibson and Lucy Mason increased their own score by nine to a combined 2075 points.



Seventeen-year-old Amanda Mlinaric scored 704 out of a possible 720 points for the 72-arrow 50-metre ranking round to set a new European junior record – subject to ratification – and lead qualification at the third stage of the 2019 Hyundai Archery World Cup in Antalya, Turkey. She also currently holds the cadet world record at 699 points.

Prize for Precision

Choi Misun of Korea was awarded the Longines Prize for Precision for recurve women at the second stage of the 2019 Hyundai Archery World Cup in Shanghai, China with a 10-rate of 50% at the event. Despite finishing eighth, she led all recurve women in the percentage of 10s shot at the competition.

Mike Schloesser of the Netherlands received the Longines Prize for Precision for compound men with a 10-rate of 94% at the third stage of the 2019 Hyundai Archery World Cup in Antalya, Turkey. The bronze medallist was seeded top and finished the event with a 150-point match, the first shot in a fully televised finals arena, with alternate shooting, in a long time. Reo Wilde was the first to achieve the feat back in 2011.

Events

Hyundai World Archery Championships

The Hyundai World Archery Championships is set to feature more than 600 archers for the first time in the event's 88-year history after final entries closed over the weekend. A total of 610 athletes from 92 countries have registered for 's-Hertogenbosch 2019. Recurve men is the largest category with 211, followed by recurve women with 161. There are also 238 compound archers entered, 139 men and 99 women.

World Cup Final 2019


This year's Hyundai Archery World Cup Final will take place on 6-7 September in Red Square in the centre of Moscow, it has been announced. The Russian capital joins Medellin, Shanghai, Antalya and Berlin as host cities on the international circuit in 2019. It will be the first international archery event to take place in Russia since the 1980 Olympic Games.






Shanghai 2019

The second stage of the 2019 Hyundai Archery World Cup took place in Shanghai, China on 6-12 May. It was the second chance for archers to secure automatic spots at this year's World Cup Final and join Medellin winners Sara Lopez, Mike Schloesser, Kang Chae Young and Brady Ellison.








The Korean recurve women's team extended its unbeaten run to six stages over 21 months.

















Antalya 2019

Danelle Wentzel beat Alexis Ruiz of the USA to the compound women's title in Antalya to become the first South African archer to win a stage of the Hyundai Archery World Cup in history. She took the final by three points, 144-141.

Danelle's win wasn't the first time on the day that the crowd in Antalya heard the South African anthem. Jeanine van Kradenburg and Reuben Brent-Meek dropped just two points in high-quality mixed team final against experienced Danes Stephan Hansen and Tanja Jensen.

James Lutz, who made his international debut at the event, shot a perfect 150-point match to beat USA teammate and defending Hyundai Archery World Cup Champion Kris Schaff by a point in the final of the third stage of the circuit in Antalya.

The gold and bronze medals were both won with perfect 150point matches. Mike Schloesser, who came close to cleaning his final at the first stage of the season in Medellin, beat Daniel Munoz to bronze with 150 points, too.

Tan Ya-Ting, Peng Chia-Mao and Lei Chien-Ying beat Mexico, 5-1, to take Chinese Taipei's first recurve women's team gold medal of 2019 next to the beach in Antalya. The recurve men's team gold medal in Antalya went to China, who beat Italy, 5-1. The USA put on probably the best display of the day, averaging 58 points a set in a 6-2 victory over Ukraine for bronze.

Universiade 2019

The final registration deadline for the upcoming Summer Universiade is Napoli is 3 June 2019. Entries must by submitted by national academic sports federations through the FISU online system. Preliminary entries totalled 253 athletes from 52 countries: 79 recurve men, 74 recurve women, 62 compound men and 59 compound women. There was 39 nations at the Universiade in 2017 in Chinese Taipei and 38 in 2015 in Korea.

OS training camp

More than 30 archers from Barbados, Colombia, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Mexico, Paraguay, Peru, Puerto Rico and Venezuela gathered in Medellin, Colombia for a joint training camp from 29 April to 4 May 2019. Sixteen of the recurve archers were fully funded by Olympic Solidarity. The sessions included individual technical assistance provided mainly by Jorge Antonio Millan and Heber Mantilla, head coaches of Colombia's national team.
