Rules

Barebow records

Barebow archers will be able to claim world records at indoor and outdoor competitions from 15 January 2020 when the new rulebook comes into effect. The changes required to add the 44 records for barebows were approved at World Archery Congress in June. Records are being introduced for the new barebow outdoor and indoor ranking rounds and can be claimed in cadet, junior, senior and master age groups.

Iceland

The Archery Association of Iceland (Bogfimisamband Islands) was officially formed on 1 December at a meeting in Reykjavik. The sport had previously been run by a group within the Icelandic National Olympic Committee. In its prior form, Iceland had been a member of World Archery since 1994. The new federation's constitution was passed unanimously and Olafur Gislason was chosen as the association's first chairman.

Achievements

World record

Sarah Prieels has broken a compound women's 60-arrow 18metre ranking round world record that only stood for three weeks, shooting 597 out of a possible 600 points during qualification at the 2019 TRUBall/Axcel Roma Archery Trophy. The previous record of 596 was set by Ella Gibson at the previous leg of the Indoor Archery World Series in Luxembourg on 23 November.

World Cup Rules

World Archery has released the rules for the 2020 Hyundai Archery World Cup following approval by the Executive Board on 8 December. Among the changes planned for the upcoming season are an increase of prize money at stages and the addition of an Olympic wildcard gualifier at the Hyundai Archery World Cup Final. A total of 217,000 CHF in prize money will be available on the 2020 Hyundai Archery World Cup.

Roma Trophy

Sarah Prieels beat Amanda Mlinaric, 148-147, in the compound women's final of the 2019 TRUBall/Axcel Roma Archery Trophy. Dave Cousins, Kang Chae Young and Marco Galiazzo also won gold medals at the third event of the 2020 Indoor Archery World Series. Cinzia Noziglia and Fredrik Lundmark won the barebow events; Iuana Bassi and Mikhail Poddevalin became longbow champions.

South Asian Games

Ruman Shana, Ety Khatun, Sohel Rana and Biswas Suma took the individual titles as Bangladesh won all 10 gold medals at the 2019 South Asian Games in Kathmandu, Nepal. Bhutan, Sri Lanka and Nepal also climbed the podium in Kathmandu, as sixty athletes from five countries participated. India, which traditionally does well at this event, was unable to compete due to the ongoing suspension of the Archery Association of India.

Road to Tokyo

The first phase of selections for Japan's national team in 2020 has cut the field of 32 to just 16 - eight men and eight women for winter training. Four archers were eliminated on 13 November and a further four on 14 November. As host country, Japan receives a full six-athlete guota for the next Olympic Games.

A triumvirate of experienced Olympians will coach the Italian archery team in 2020. Sante Spigarelli, Natalia Valeeva and Matteo Bisiani have all been named to senior positions on a renovated staff for the squad heading into the upcoming Olympic year. Italy has qualified two places to Tokyo 2020 and will look to add four more in June.

Olympic trials have started in Chinese Taipei but World Archery Champion Lei Chien-Ying is not taking part - because she's already been named to the squad for Tokyo 2020. Taipei trials procedure dictated that a world championship podium meant automatic selection for the Olympic squad. Chinese Taipei qualified a full six-athlete quota to the Olympics at the world championships.

Perth 2021

Perth was awarded hosting rights for the 2021 World Archery Youth Championships during a meeting of the World Archery Executive Board on 6 December 2019. The city will become the first in Australia to host an archery world championships since Canberra held the field event in 2002 and Adelaide had the senior world championships in 1987. Perth was selected ahead of Dublin, Ireland and Wroclaw, Poland.

Birmingham 2021

The qualification system for the archery competitions - both target and field - at the Birmingham 2021 World Games has been approved by the International World Games Association and released by World Archery. The document outlines the total number of quota places, how they will be allocated and deadlines in the procedure. A total of 100 archers will compete: 48 recurve and barebow archers in the field events and 52 compound archers in the target competition.

Dakar 2022

The number of archers that will compete at the next Youth Olympic Games is set to increase by 50% to a total of 96 following the approval of the sports and event programme at Dakar 2022 by the International Olympic Committee's executive board. Sixty-four athletes competed at the first three editions of the Games in Singapore, Nanjing and Buenos Aires. Dakar 2022 will be the first Olympic event to take place in Africa.

Coaching

Costa Rica

Twenty-two coaches and two judges - 19 men and five women - took part in a level one coaching course in Costa Rica on 18 to 24 November 2019 under the expertise of Mexico's Santiago Avitia Martinez. The goal of the seminar was to educate national coaches by providing them with the knowledge to coach beginner archers.

New education programme

The first 17 people were certified as level 1 coaches under World Archery's new education programme at the end of a five-day course in the World Archery Excellence Centre that ended on 1 December. Developed in association with the World Academy of Sport, the new coaching certification has two parts - the first is an online module and the second is a practical workshop. World Archery's new coach education programme grants diplomas valid for four years.

French e-learning and coaching certification

World Archery has launched the French version of the new online certification programme for level one archery coaches. Across eight e-learning modules, candidates will test their theoretical knowledge in multiple-choice evaluations. Passing this online programme grants access to a fiveday practical workshop where successful participants are accredited as level one coaches.

The first practical workshop in French is scheduled to take place in the World Archery Excellence Centre in Lausanne, Switzerland on 9 to 14 March 2020. Persons interested in attending should complete the online course before 10 February 2020.

Before the practical training the candidates will also have to complete the following:

- Pre-course reading

Coach candidates should have a minimum of two years archery experience and have competed in at least two events from the official calendar of any World Archery member association.

They must also provide evidence of attendance to a practical workshop held under the World Archery-issued manuals from 2003 or 2015 and an endorsement from their national federation that they are an active coach.

Judging

African seminar

World Archery Africa organised a continental seminar for judges at the National Sports Center Moulay Rachid in the city of Salé, Morocco, with the support of the Royal Moroccan Archery Federation. The two-part programme included basic Ianseo and continental judge training, and was supervised by Khaled Lamandé, World Archery's development agent in Africa, and international judges Ahmed Koura and Christophe Pezet.



Six participants from four countries attended the Ianseo seminar and gained experience that will benefit the organisation of domestic tournaments. Eight people from five countries attended the continental judge training and gained practical experience in calling arrow values and managing team events, along with theorical knowledge about international rules, standards and processes in preparation for future events and a future continental exam planned for 2020.
