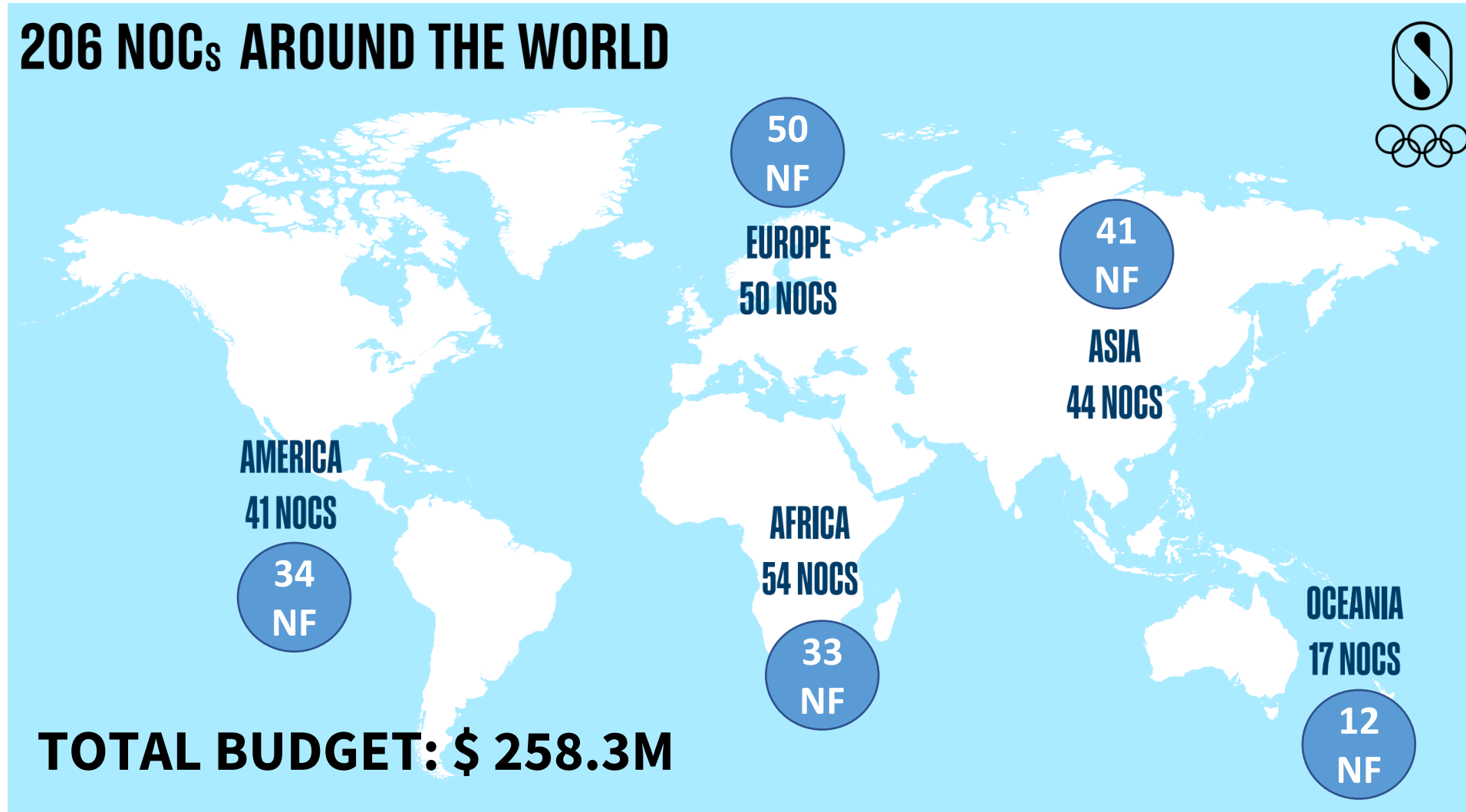

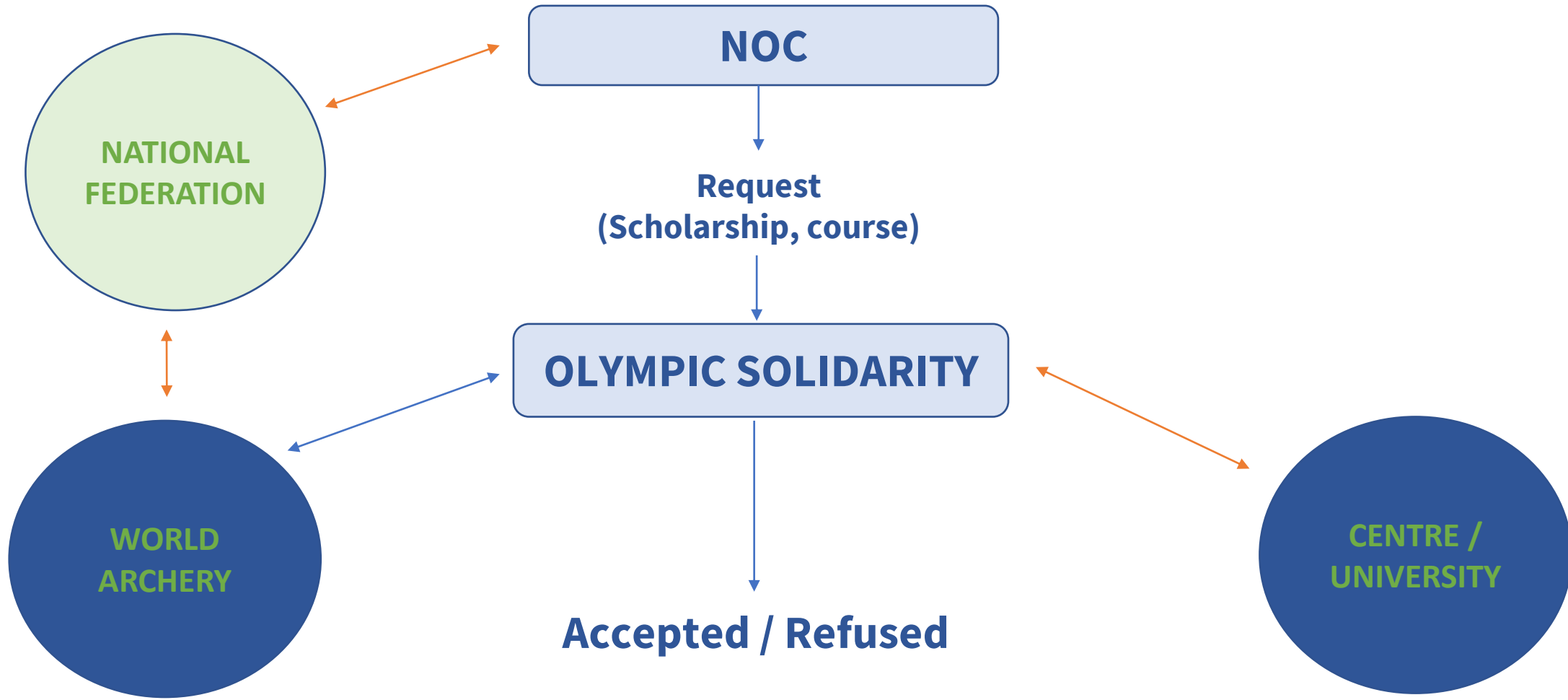


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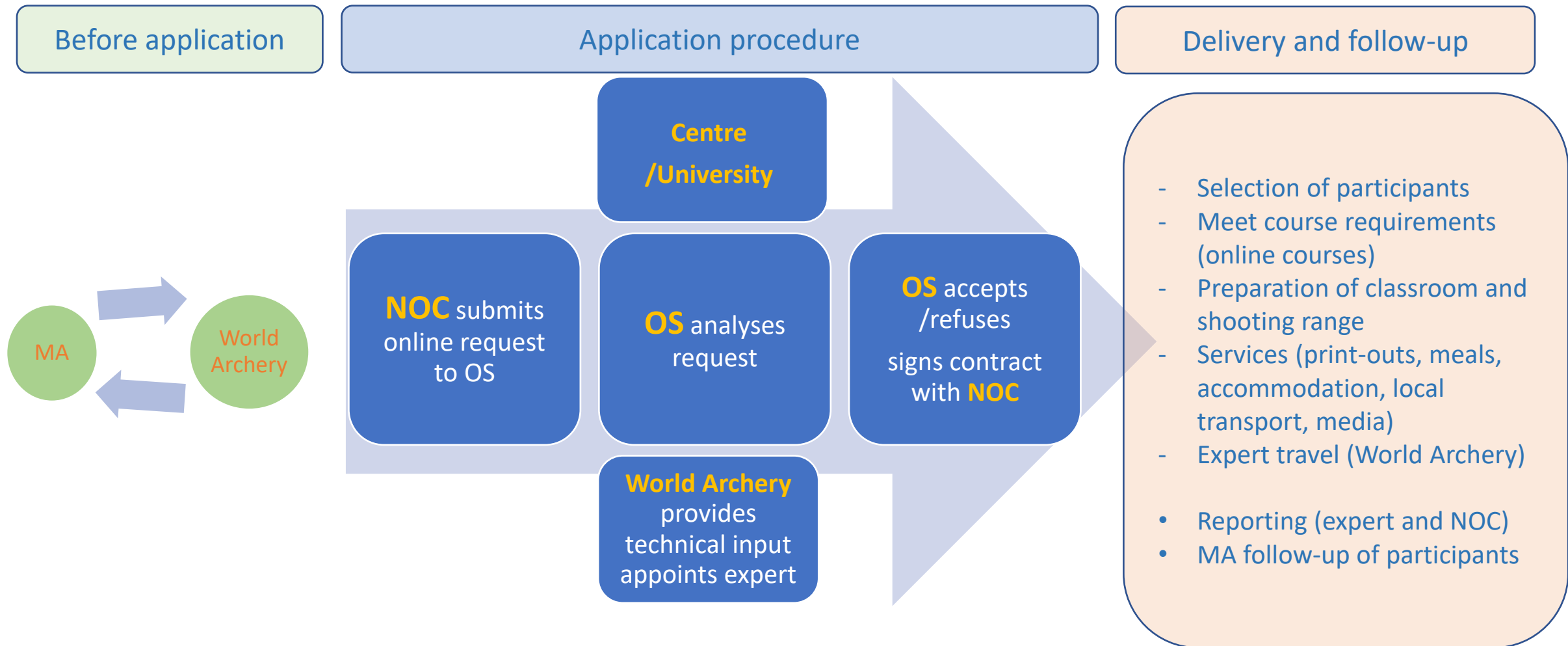

Technical courses for coaches



Technical courses for coaches

Objective: offer short-term coaches training at different levels

- Expand the base of entry-level coaches (coaching course **level 1**)
- Train coaches to acquire intermediate coaching skills (coaching course **level 2**)
- Develop high performance coaching skills (coaching course advanced/ **level 3**)

Target group: open to all NOCs/MAs (priority given to those with greatest needs)

- for active coaches
- working in their own country and recognised by MA/World Archery
- Actively support the participation of women, accounting for a min. 25% of total participants





Options available

1. **National courses** – in collaboration with World Archery, may include modules on judging and for coaching athletes with disabilities
2. **Regional courses (limited)** – World Archery can propose the organisation of regional courses for coaches
3. **Courses specifically aimed at female coaches only**
4. **Coach trainer courses** (educators' training), and more...

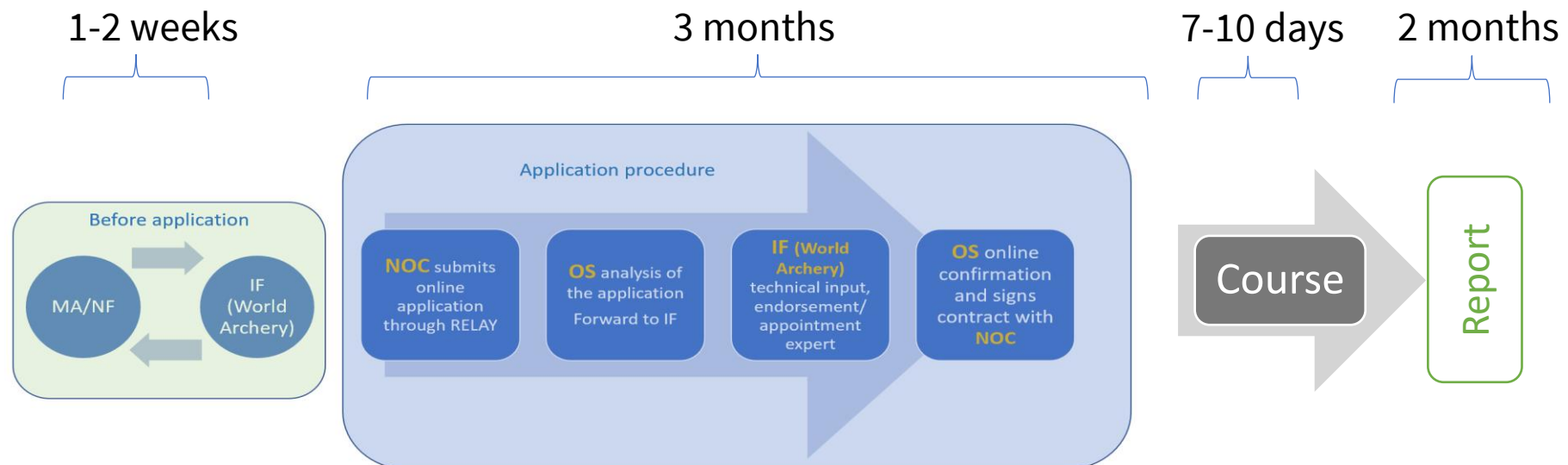
Technical courses for coaches

Financial conditions: max. 10 courses per NOC per Olympiad.

Budget for each course on average **USD 8,000 - USD 10,000**

Application: must include description of the NF coaching education structure, type of course, list of participants, CV of the expert, budget

Timeline and phases:



World Archery coach education system



<u>Level 1</u>	Given by coach trainer Online theory + practical course + evaluation (jury with 2 coach trainers)	<u>World Archery level 1 certificate</u>
Level 1	In any other conditions than above	Diploma of attendance
<u>Level 2</u>	World Archery coaching course level 2	Diploma of attendance
<u>Level 3</u>	World Archery coaching course level 3	Diploma of attendance

- Each member association can decide if to use their own coaching education system (often national system for all sports) or to adopt World Archery system and levels
- In case MA has their own system, it is necessary to decide equivalency or if/how World Archery courses could be adapted to the system or not.

NB! Education system is being renewed. World Archery has not created certification system for level 2 and 3 (yet).

Technical courses for coaches

Experience from World Archery Iceland

Before application:

- Contact your NOC and find the person that oversees Olympic Solidarity applications there
- NOC will apply for OS grant, not your NF or WA
- For success it is important to have good communication with NOC



Technical courses for coaches

Experience from World Archery Iceland

Preparing an application

- Prepare all information as early as possible, ideally 6 months in advance
- Contact World Archery for assistance to get:
 - Recommendation of expert (and check availability)
 - Course programme template
 - Advice or anything in the process



Technical courses for coaches

Experience from World Archery Iceland

Preparing an application

Template with all information needed to submit, e.g

- **How and why did you select this course?**

More coaches are needed to ensure that the current athletes and clubs have the assistance they need and remain active with the sport, and to provide the base for future development.

- **Materials available for practical / technical sessions and online modules**

We rent the facilities and equipment for the practical course. The facility is a fully equipped archery centre that is also tailor made for this type of seminars

- **What is your archery coaching education structure in your country?**

We use the NOC coaching education and World Archery coaching education system for the archery specific education with 3 levels

- **Does your NF have a database for the follow up of active coaches?**

Yes, we have an excel document in the shared storage of the archery federation for all the individuals that have sat coaching seminars within our federation.



Technical courses for coaches

Experience from World Archery Iceland

Organisation of the course

- **Prioritise participants** that are currently actively instructing/coaching in clubs.
- Make sure the **expert will be well taken care** of (accommodation, food, transport)
- Keep the **archery range and classroom close** to save time (same location preferably)





Olympic scholarships for coaches



Olympic scholarships for coaches

Objective: allow coaches to benefit from continuous high-level training and acquire experience and know-how abroad, not in the home country

Target group:

- Coaches officially recognised by MA/World Archery (profile in World Archery extranet!)
- with active records and experience (for level 2 or 3 coaches)
- with ability to transfer knowledge to develop archery

♂ Gender equity. At least 1-2 female candidatures/quadrennia





Options available

1. Sports sciences training at a higher level sports centre or university, and obtain a diploma or certificate

The main centres are:

Olympic scholarships for coaches



Options available

2. **Sport-specific training programme** in an international/continental/regional centre (e.g. **WAEC**)
3. **Tailor-made training** in locations other than those indicated by OS if they provide content that is better adapted to the needs of coaches

Financial conditions

- NOC to get 1-2 scholarships per year
- All costs covered (transport, accommodation, meals, course fee, insurance if needed)

Olympic scholarships for coaches



Process

Candidature

- Mandatory NOC/MA contacts centre/World Archery for **pre-admission** of the candidate
- NOC submits application to OS min. 2 months prior to the training

Analysis and approval

- OS contacts World Archery and the centre for technical advice
- OS approves/refuses and signs tripartite contract NOC-coach-centre

Monitoring and control

- Coach and centre provide reporting documents (within 2 months)

Experience from Pakistan and Uganda

(Sports sciences training - ICECP)

- October 2020 – April 2023
- Pakistan: Coaches education programme
- Uganda: Grassroot development: archery toolkit guide for PE classes (graduated with honours)



Olympic scholarships for coaches

Experience from Guinea

(Sports sciences training - PAISAC)

Founded in 2006, 150 archers, low income country group, 4 OS projects so far

- First archery coach to be admitted in the programme
- NOC suggested to apply
- NF is very active and has good relationships with NOC
- Selection of candidate based on experience, capacity and availability
- Coach certified CCL1
- Currently in online phase (time consuming)
- Only best candidates are invited to in-person module

Sports-specific training programme – Excellence Centre in Lausanne

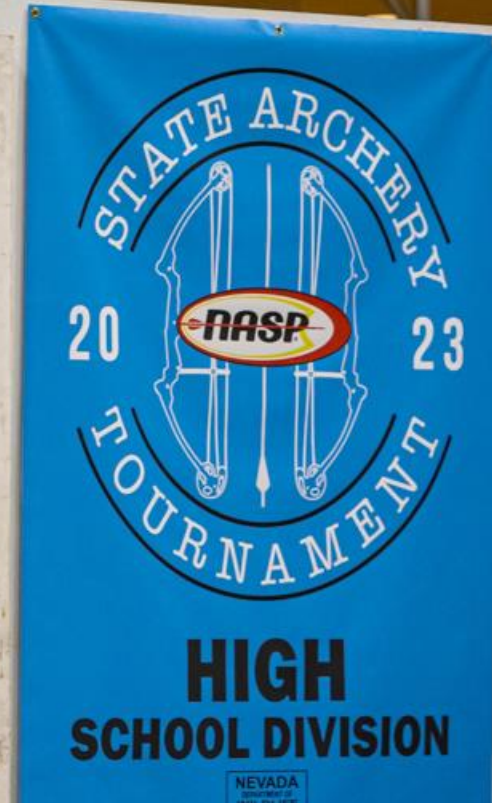
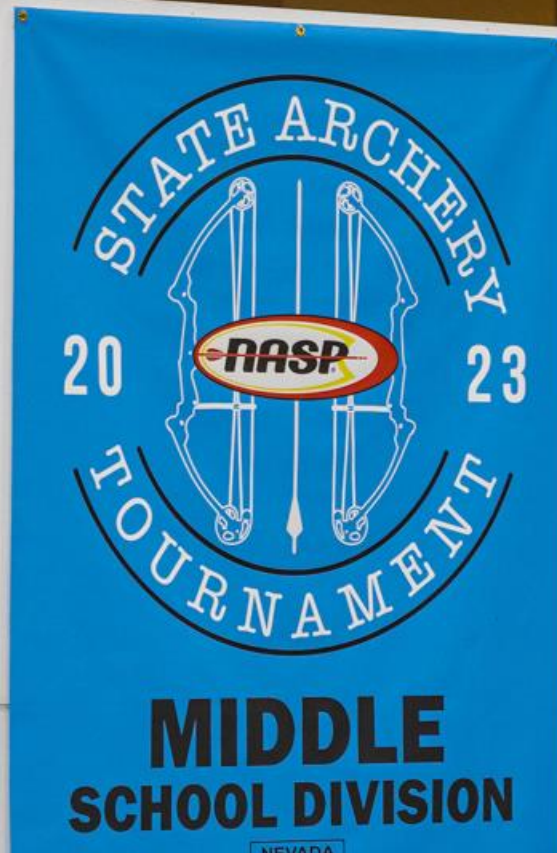
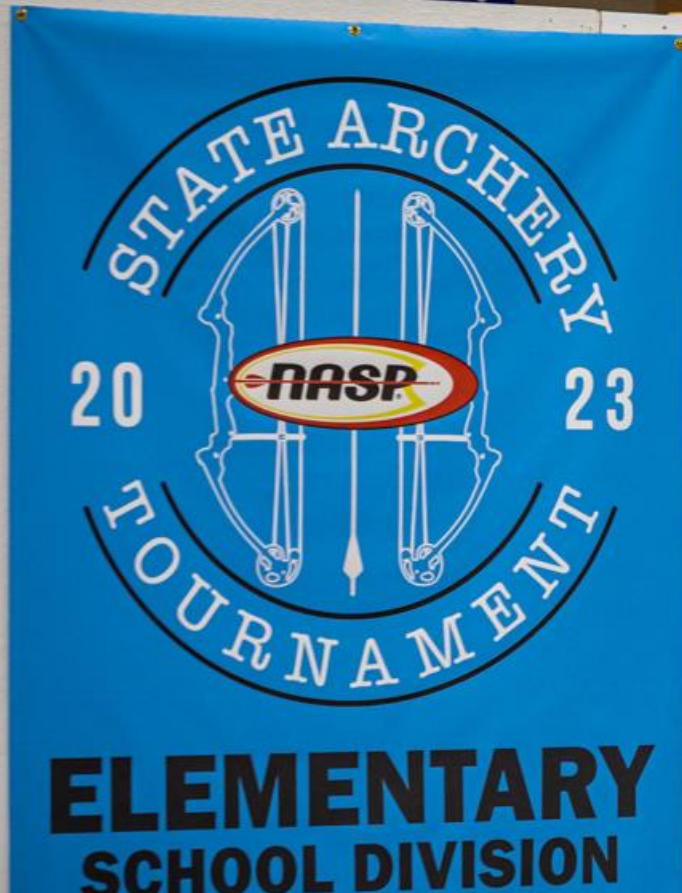
Six-weeks (max. 5 coaches/group)

Group 1: basic level

Group 2: intermediate-advanced

- Coaching courses (level 1 or 3 and level 2, depending on the group)
- Coaches will take an active part in activities organised in the Centre
- 180+ hours of education and practice





Development of National Sports System (DNSS)



Objective: to improve the basic coach education system through a medium/long-term action plan

Target group: NOC/MAs with basic sports structures, weak training systems, potential for improvement

Two options available:

1. **Standard option** - Sport-based project
2. **Short-term pre-visit**



Standard option

Topics (according to the need)

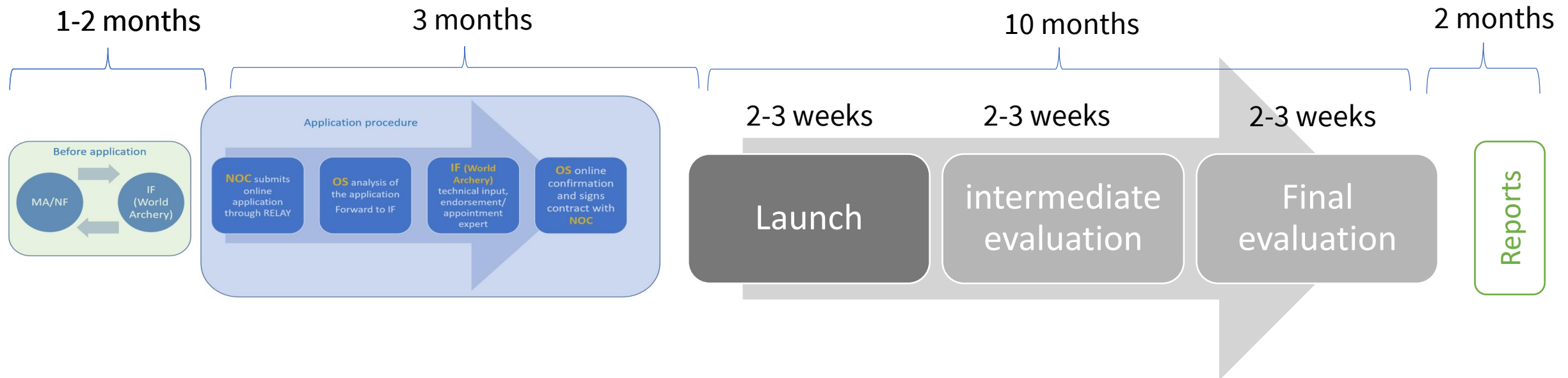
- action plan for coaching and education programme (**courses for coaches**)
 - initiatives for **grassroots development**
 - training, competition and **national team selection** systems
 - **elite training** programme
 - **monitoring system** for athletes/coaches/judges
 - Improve **good governance** policies, capacity building and **MA management**
 - In-depth analysis of existing system by IF expert
 - Define a realistic action plan and objectives
- NB! Not for hiring coach for national team or only organising coaching courses

Development of National Sports System



Standard option

Timelines and project phases



Please be prepared that it will take time to coordinate everything: application must arrive OS at least 3 months prior to the start of the project



Standard option

Application

- description of sport system structure
- SWOT
- SMART objectives
- deliverables
- detailed action plan
- detailed budget proposal

Financial conditions

- Budget for each project **USD 25,000 – 30,000** (includes costs of expert)
- One project per year and per NOC

Standard option

Experience from Uganda

Founded in 1987, 90 archers, low income country group, 4 OS grants so far

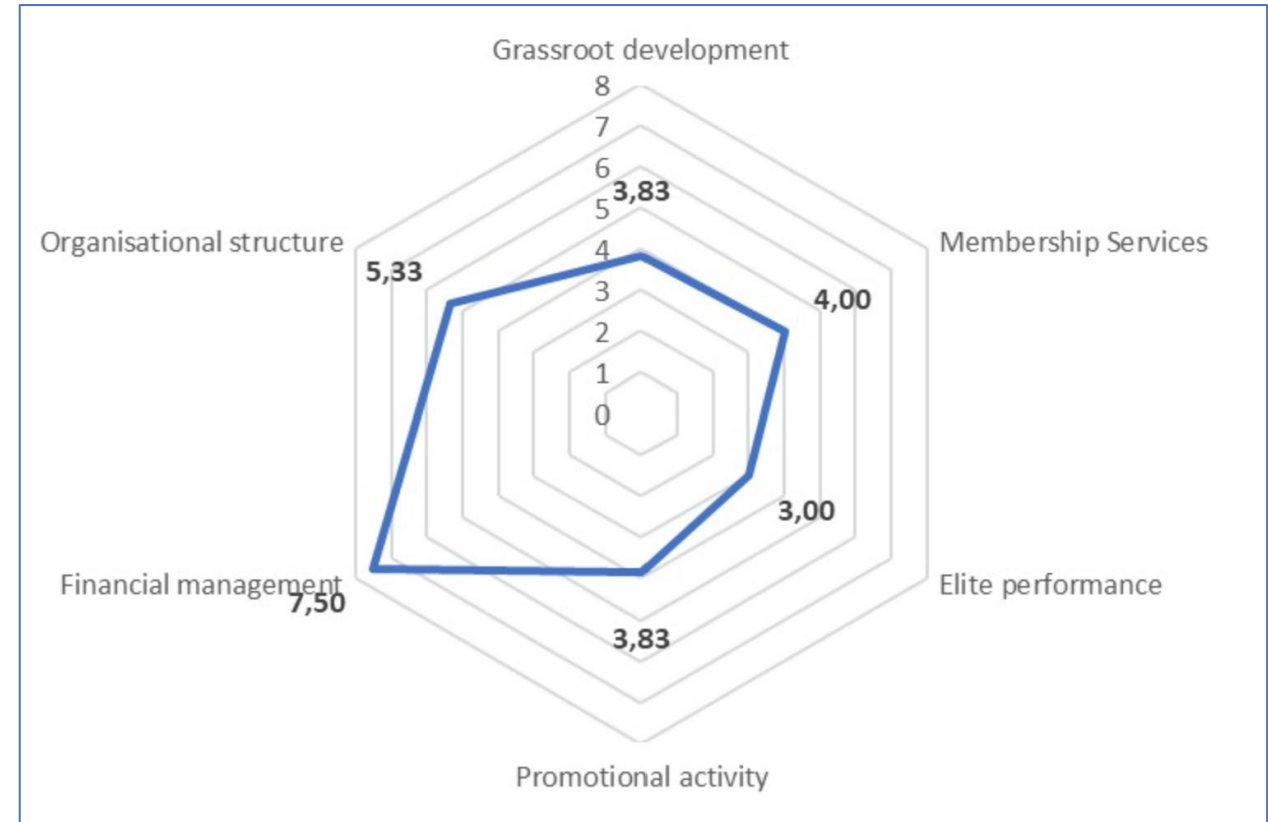
- NOC support – visit of Pascal Colmaire to NOC Uganda in 2019
- Application 2022 – review by WA, improved SWOT, objectives and action plan, added equipment request
- 1st visit March 2023 – partnerships, selection of coaches, strategy review



Standard option

Experience from Uganda

- Online follow-up to finalize strategy, constitution review
- Purchase of equipment
- 2nd visit – tailored made coaching courses, implement WA beginner award programme, shooting day, concrete archery promotion action (video)
- 3rd visit – judges course, training camp, shooting day, wrap up and project closure





Standard option

Experience from Uganda

“There are 31 national federations that also want to benefit from OS programmes...we had to keep on requesting for it till we got it. It is very competitive and we tried all our efforts to get it in a competitive way, also we are in good books with our NOC”

Coming soon:

- **Malawi** (grassroot development)
- **El Salvador** (high level programme)



Short-term pre-visit option

Objective: short-term pre-visit for self-assessment of a sport systems and develop an action plan

Target group: NOCs with the greatest needs

Characteristics

- Conducted by an IF-accredited expert
- On site or online

Expected output: identify strategies, timelines and deliverables and preparation for apply to the DNSS standard option

Financial conditions

- Total cost of the mission may vary drastically (online and/or on site) and will be approved on a case-by-case basis



Youth Athlete Development

Youth Athlete Development

Youth Continental Training Camp

- Organised and announced by World Archery and continental associations
- For athletes and their coaches (3 max.)
- Criteria:
 - NOC with 50+ athletes in last Olympics
 - Athlete under the age of 23 years
 - Minimum score required
 - Gender balance
- More information will be provided soon for camps in 2023/2024 (Africa, Americas, Asia, Europe and Oceania)
- Costs during the camp covered and/or partly flights

Knowledge Sharing Programme



Education and development projects

- Travel and expert's fee covered, but MA bear costs on site, or
- Fully online sessions to develop policies/systems

Available in 9 areas

1. Coach education (**for MA with no NOC/refused request**)
2. Judge education
3. Performance
4. Para archery
5. Compound
6. Competitions
7. Result Management
8. Media and broadcast
9. Financial management

Applications will be open **September-October 2023** for implementation in 2024



Equipment support programme



Support on a one-time basis

Three levels of equipment:

1. Beginner kit: 12 sets of entry level bows and arrows with accessories.
2. Intermediate kit: five sets of recreational-level competition bows and arrows.
3. Advanced kit: two sets of elite-level competition bows and arrows.

Applications will be open **July-August** for shipping early 2024.

Yes, but only for World Archery resident coach programme (6-weeks) which is a longer study programme, not just attending one course.

4. How can we get a World Archery coaching course in our country? (question raised by NAM, GUY, PNG)

Olympic Solidarity

- Maintain good relationships with your NOC as applications are only through NOC
- Always inform/consult World Archery before applying
- Anticipate deadlines!
- Applying does not guarantee that you will get the funds. Limited number of projects funded per NOC and archery competes with all other Olympic sports
- Submit a consistent application
- Consider gender balance and online learning in your proposal/application
- Carefully check criteria before applying
