4.4.3 The Prohibited List can identify certain substances, methods or routes of administration that are not prohibited, but for which an athlete is required to file a Declaration of Use, in accordance with the specific procedures outlined in the International Standard for Therapeutic Use Exemptions. Any such use should be declared on the Doping Control Form, and when available, through ADAMS. An athlete's failure to declare use on the Doping Control Form and through ADAMS when available shall not be an anti-doping rule violation, but may be subject to a written warning.

As an exception to Article 4.4.2, in accordance with Article 7.13 of the International Standard for Therapeutic Use Exemptions, Athletes not in FITA's Registered Testing Pool who inhale salbutamol or salmeterol to treat asthma or one of its clinical variants do not need a TUE in advance of participating in an International Event. Instead, if necessary, any such Athlete should declare this use through ADAMS at the same time as the use starts and must be declared on the Doping Control Form at the time of testing. Any such Athlete may apply for a Retroactive TUE after the Event in accordance with Article 7.13 of the International Standard for Therapeutic Use Exemptions and Article 7.1.3 of these Anti-Doping Rules. As a further exception, Athletes using Glucocorticosteroids by non systemic routes namely, intraarticular, periarticular, peritendinous, epidural, intradermal injections and inhaled route will be required to file a declaration of use at the same time the use starts, and must declare the use of the substance in question on the Doping Control Form at the time of Testing.
