## **BYLAW**

## Approved by FITA Council on 29 August 2009 Effective as of 1 April 2010

## Book 2, Articles 7.6.4.1 and 7.6.4.2

7.6.4.1 The organisers shall not be required to accept or record scorecards that have not been signed, do not contain the sum total, the number of 10's or the number of X's or which contain mathematical errors. The organisers or officials are not required to verify the accuracy of any submitted scorecard however if the organisers or the officials note an error, they will correct such error and the result as corrected shall stand. Any such corrections must occur before the next stage of competition.

> In tournaments where there are no official scorers and the athletes score themselves, the signing of the score card also denotes that the athlete agrees with the sum total (identical on both score cards), the number of 10's and the number of X's. Should a discrepancy be found in the sum total, the sum total of the lowest arrow scores will become final.

> The organisers are not obligated to accept or record scorecards that are submitted without signatures, the total sum, the number of 10's and the number of X's.

7.6.4.2 For all Elimination and Finals Rounds scorecards shall be signed by the two athletes in the match, denoting that both athletes or archers' agents agree with the value of each arrow, the total sum, the number of Xs, 10s and the result of the <u>sets</u> and match. Any information missing on the scorecard will be considered as non-existing (0) for rankings.
