BYLAW

<u>Approved by FITA Council on 14 November 2010</u> Effective as of 1 January 2011

Book 4, Article 9.6.3.2.1 and 9.6.3.2.2

9.6.3.2.1 *Individuals:*

- A single arrow shoot-off for score (maximum of three shoot-offs);
- If there is still a tie in the third shoot-off, the second arrow closest to the centre will resolve the tie; or
- Successive single arrow closest-to-the-centre shoot-offs, until the tie is resolved;
- The time limit for a shoot-off will be 1/3 of the applicable time limit (60 seconds).

9.6.3.2.2 Teams:

- An end of three (3) arrows (1 by each athlete) shoot-off for score (maximum of three shoot-offs);
- If the score is still tied in the third shoot off, the team with the closest-to-the-centre arrow will win;
- If still tied the second (or third) closest-to-the-centre arrow will determine the winner;
- If necessary there will be successive three (3) arrow (one arrow by each athlete) shoot-offs for score if necessary followed by closest to the centre evaluation until the tie is resolved;
- The time limit for a Team shoot-off will be <u>3 minutes</u>.
